#### **SPORTS ACTION**

The Midland High girls' Varsity volleyball team took first place as champions at the Waterford Our Lady of the Lakes (OLL) tournament on Saturday September 21st. In pool play, the Chemics went 4-0 beating Livonia Clarenceville, Royal Oak Shrine, OLL, and Farmington Huda to be seeded first out of their pool. In the quarterfinals, Midland beat Waterford Mott in 2 sets, 25-10, 25-14. In the semifinals match #6, the Chemics defeated Durand 25-14, 25-13. In the final match #7 on the day, Midland beat Chelsea winning set 1, 25-15, losing close set 2, 25-27, and winning the match in third set, 15-9 to have an undefeated day 7-0.
