Louisville Municipal School District is pleased to announce we will be participating in **Provision 2** of the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and the National School Breakfast Program (SBP) at **Fair Elementary School, Louisville Elementary School, Eiland Middle School, Louisville High School, Nanih Waiya Attendance Center, and Noxapater Attendance Center** this school year (26-27).

This program allows us to offer meals at **no charge** to all participating children. Your child will be able to receive a healthy and nutritious meal at school free of charge. All items that are considered extra sale will **not** apply.

To continue providing free meals under Provision 2, every household must complete a **meal application**. If we have all households complete an application this year, students could potentially eat for free for the next three years. Completing a meal application is extremely important for your child to continue eating for free. **Failure to complete applications could result in LMSD School Food Service being unable to continue providing free meals to all students.**

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
