

**MOBILE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM
SCHOOL-PARENT COMPACT**

School Responsibilities

2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held:

6. Ensure regular two-way, meaningful communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand.

- Haskew will communicate with parents throughout the school year via bi-weekly/monthly school bulletins, newsletters, school website, social media, and school messenger. All parent notifications will be provided in a variety of languages if necessary.

Parent Responsibilities

- Volunteering in my child's classroom.
- Participating, as appropriate, in decisions relating to my children's education.

- Read at least 30 minutes every day outside of school time.
