  - Please use the drop off/pickup area near the awnings.



## **Dress Code**

- No Hats/Hoods on your head at any time
- No Undergarment exposure
- Skirts, Dresses, and Shorts must reach mid-thigh
- No holes above mid-thigh that allow skin to show
- No crop tops that allow skin to show
- Bandanas (or bandana print) of any color are prohibited.
- Leggings may be worn, but a dress, shirt, or skirt must be worn over the leggings. The dress, shirt, or skirt must be mid-thigh length or longer.
- Pajama pants are not permitted.

## **Electronic Devices**

- Earbuds/headphones CAN NOT be worn at any time during the school day.
- Cell phones are not allowed during the school day, except for during lunch.
- Lunch phone rules:
  - No earbuds/AirPods
  - No photos or videos should be taken
  - No music should be played from the phone
  - No calls are to be made or received
- If wearing earbuds/headphones while going to a parking lot or before/after school, only one ear should be in use/covered for safety purposes.

## **Athletics/Extracurricular Activities**


- All 9th grade students are eligible to participate in athletics during Fall semester.

- Students will attend lunch with their 5th period class.
- Students can eat the Main Cafeteria, Middle Cafeteria, or Outdoor Dining area, but not the Senior Cafeteria.
- Multiple line options are available in all cafeteria areas.



## **General Information**

- Beneficial Enrichment and Remediation (BEAR) Time takes place every Tuesday and Thursday for approximately 40 minutes.
- Students have freedom to travel through the entire building during transition, and will not be escorted class-to-class. It is the student's responsibility to follow the shortest and quickest route to avoid being tardy.
- There are 5 minutes between classes. There is a bell to warn students that they have 1 minute to be in class as well as a tardy bell to begin each period.
- Late entry to each class period will produce tardies, which carry appropriate consequences.

It is designed to help students understand, communicate and adapt to a digital world as it impacts their personal life, society and the business world. This course exposes students to computer hardware, software, programming, web design, IT support and networks. Employability skills, problem solving and professional communication/presentation skills are integrated into the course to prepare students to be college and career ready.

### **AF JROTC**



AFJROTC objectives are to educate and train high school cadets in citizenship and life skills; promote community service; instill a sense responsibility, develop character, leadership, and self-discipline through education and instruction in air and space fundamentals and the Air Force's core values of Integrity First, Service Before Self, and Excellence In All We Do.



#### **PE/Weights**

#### Lifetime Sports

Enhances skills and strategies in lifetime sports such as bowling, golf, tennis, racquetball, baseball, badminton, roller skating and skiing.

#### Team Sports

Enhances skills and strategies in team sports such as basketball, volleyball, soccer, softball, baseball, field hockey, lacrosse, team handball and flag football.

#### Football Weights



Introduces weight training; emphasizes strength development training and proper lifting techniques. Includes fitness concepts for developing healthy lifetime habits.

#### **Fine Arts**

#### Band



Provides opportunities to develop performance skills on a wind, brass, or percussion instrument. Emphasizes performance and production. May include analysis, historical and cultural influences, improvisation, and appreciation of music. Organizes objectives for self-paced progress. Stresses individual progress and group experiences.

#### Beginning Men's and Women's Chorus

Provides opportunities for young men and young women to develop performance skills and knowledge in all-male or all-female choral singing. Covers performance and production, analysis and theoretical studies, historical and cultural contributions and influences, creative aspects of music and appreciation of music. Organizes objectives for self-paced progress through all four levels. Stresses individual progress and group experiences.

#### Fine Arts Theater Fundamentals

This course serves as an introduction to the theatre arts. Students investigate theatre as a whole by exploring the techniques and origins of a wide variety of theatre arts in various cultures and periods.









## Foreign Language

#### French 1



Introduces the French language; emphasizes all skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing in an integrated way. Includes how to greet and take leave of someone, to ask and respond to basic questions, to speak and read within a range of carefully selected topics and to develop an understanding of French-speaking cultures.

#### Spanish 1

Introduces the Spanish language; emphasizes all skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills in an integrated way. Includes how to greet and take leave of someone, to ask and respond to basic questions, to speak and read within a range of carefully selected topics and to develop an understanding of Spanish-speaking cultures.

## **Registration Overview**

Students will take 7 classes *per semester* worth 0.5 credit each. Obtaining 5 credits is required to earn classification as a sophomore, which means 10/14 classes must be passed. Your high school GPA begins at the end of Fall semester, so a good start is important.

Registration is for the full academic year 2022-2023. Students take part A of each course first semester and part B second semester.

As a freshman, 5 classes are required

- → 9th Grade Literature
- → Algebra 1 or Honors Geometry
- → Biology
- → American Government/US & World Affairs
- → Health & Personal Fitness
  - In Health, students will fulfill the requirements for ADAP, which is required to receive a Georgia driver's license.

The remaining 2 classes are electives.

Students will select four elective classes in order of their preference on their registration form.

We do our very best to schedule the top two selections, however if those classes are full or do not fit in the schedule, the third and fourth choice may be scheduled.
