 $4^{\rm th}~Grade$ - Fourth grade has recently been learning about fractions as well as reviewing all the other math concepts learned since the beginning of this school year. In Science, we are currently learning about erosion and weathering. We have also learned about different types of minerals that can be found in the Earth. Social Studies is a continuation of the learning about the history of our great state, Alabama.
