Dedicated band members gave the extra time to entertain the school and community at Christmas and three other concerts.

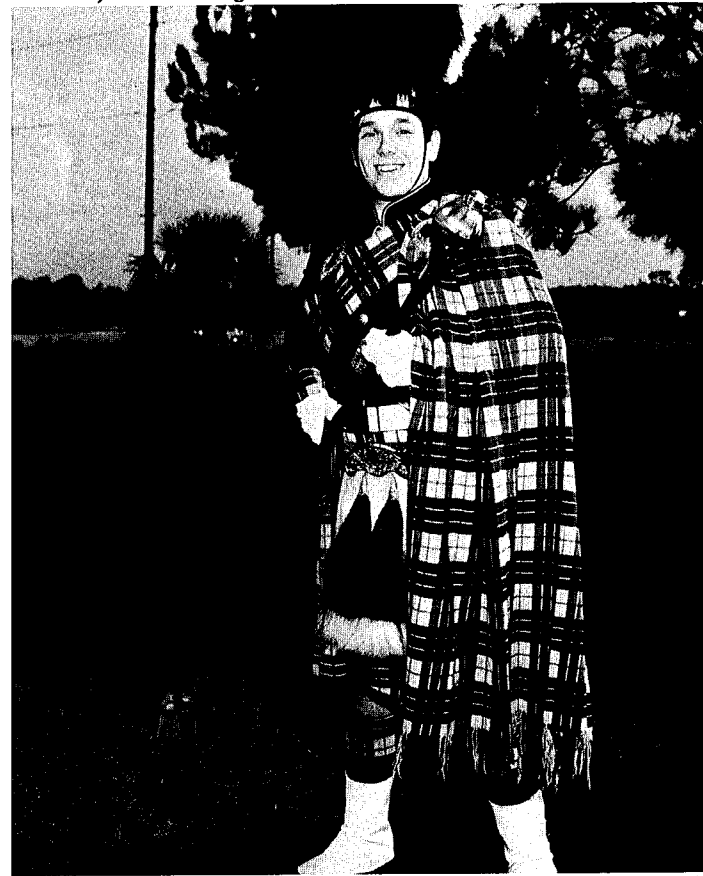

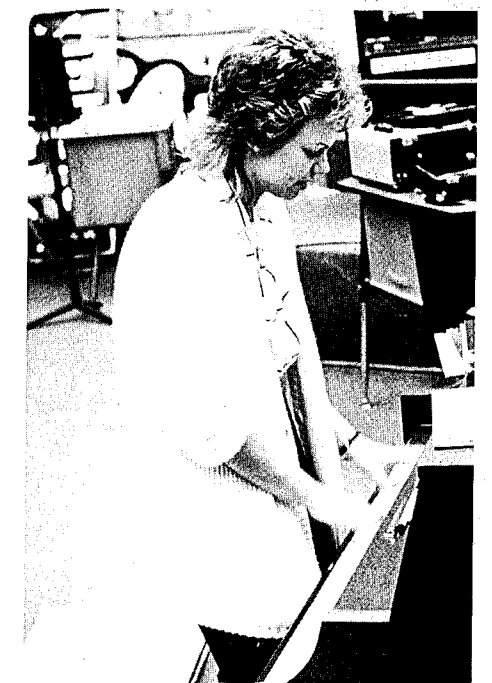

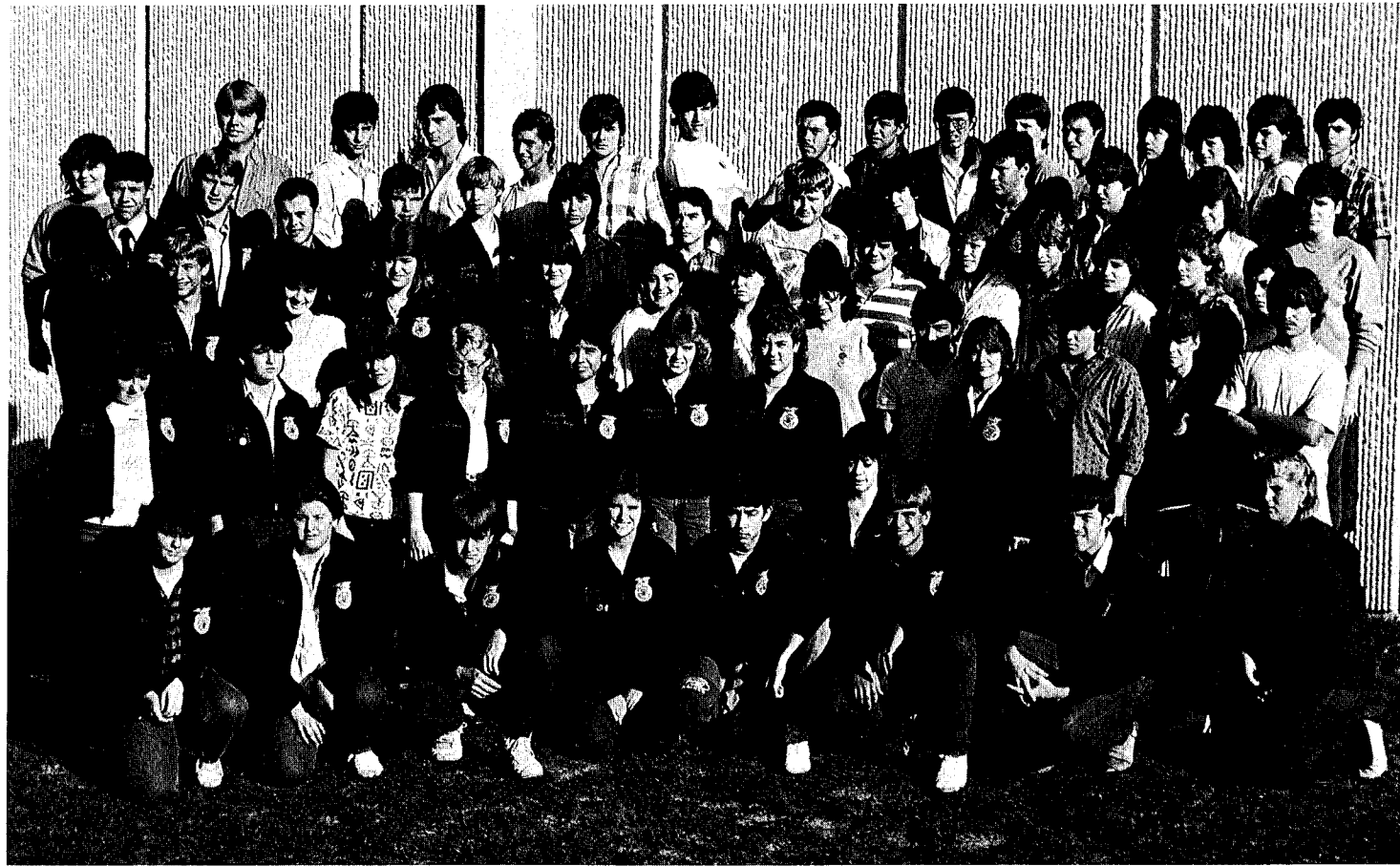

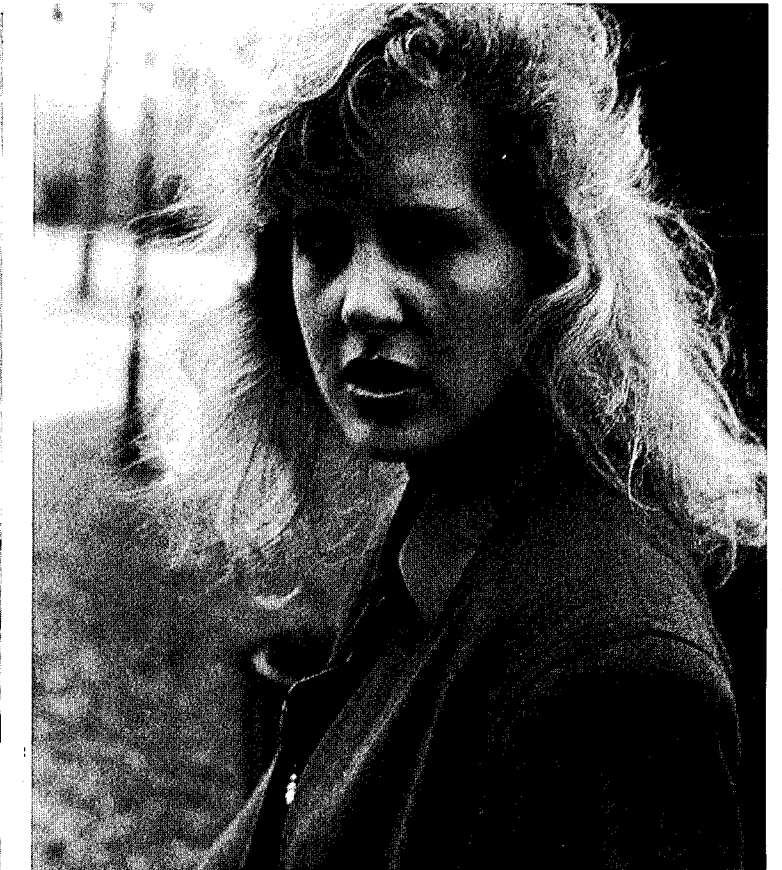

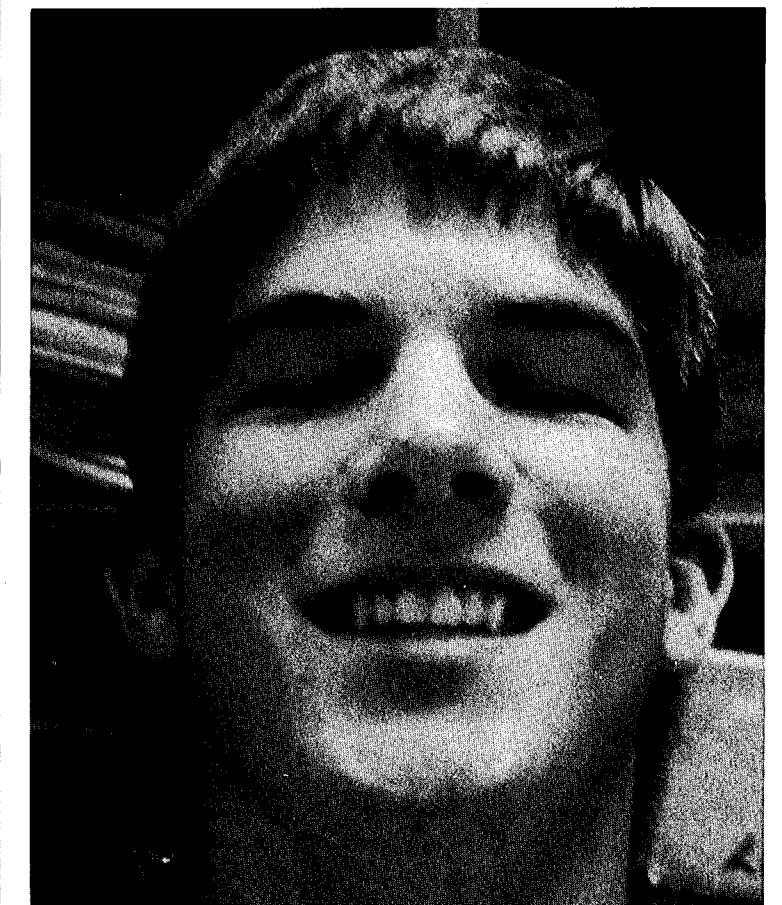

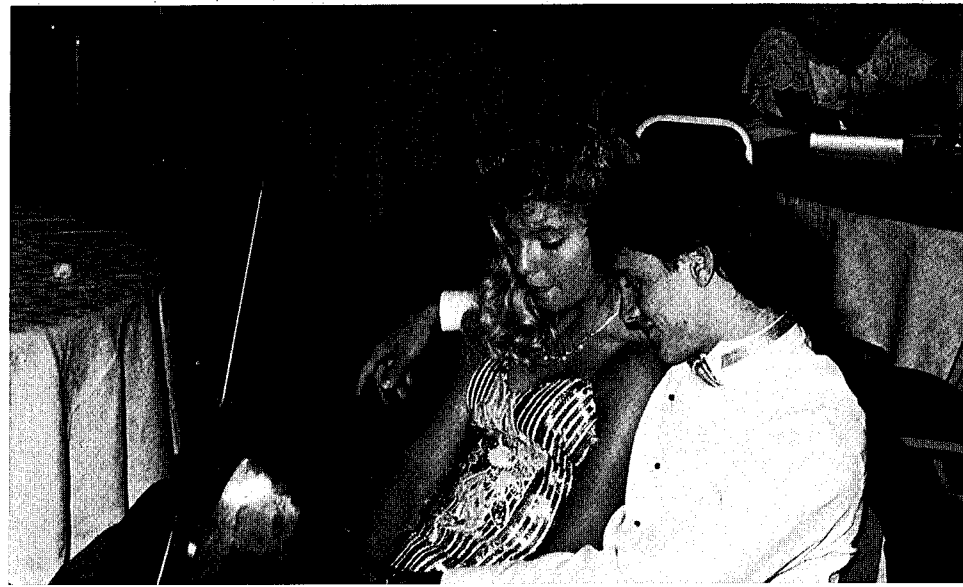

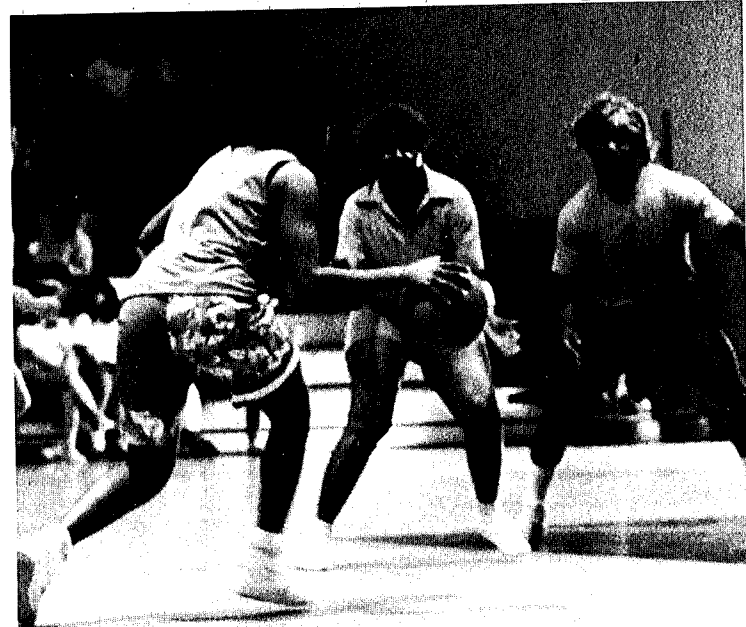

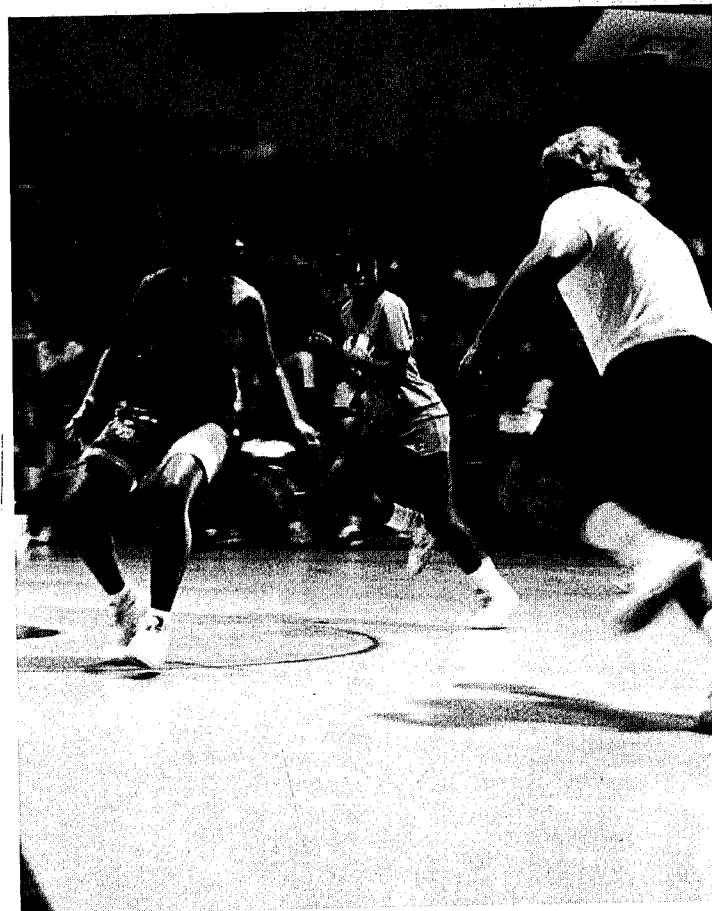

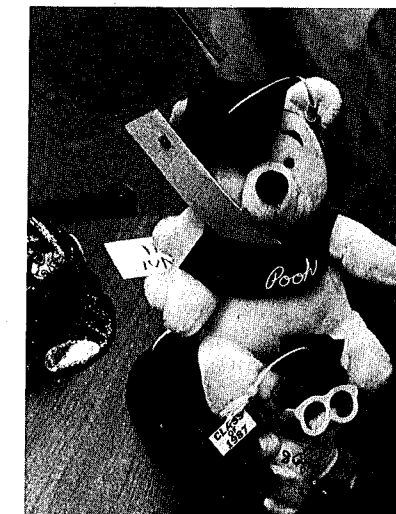

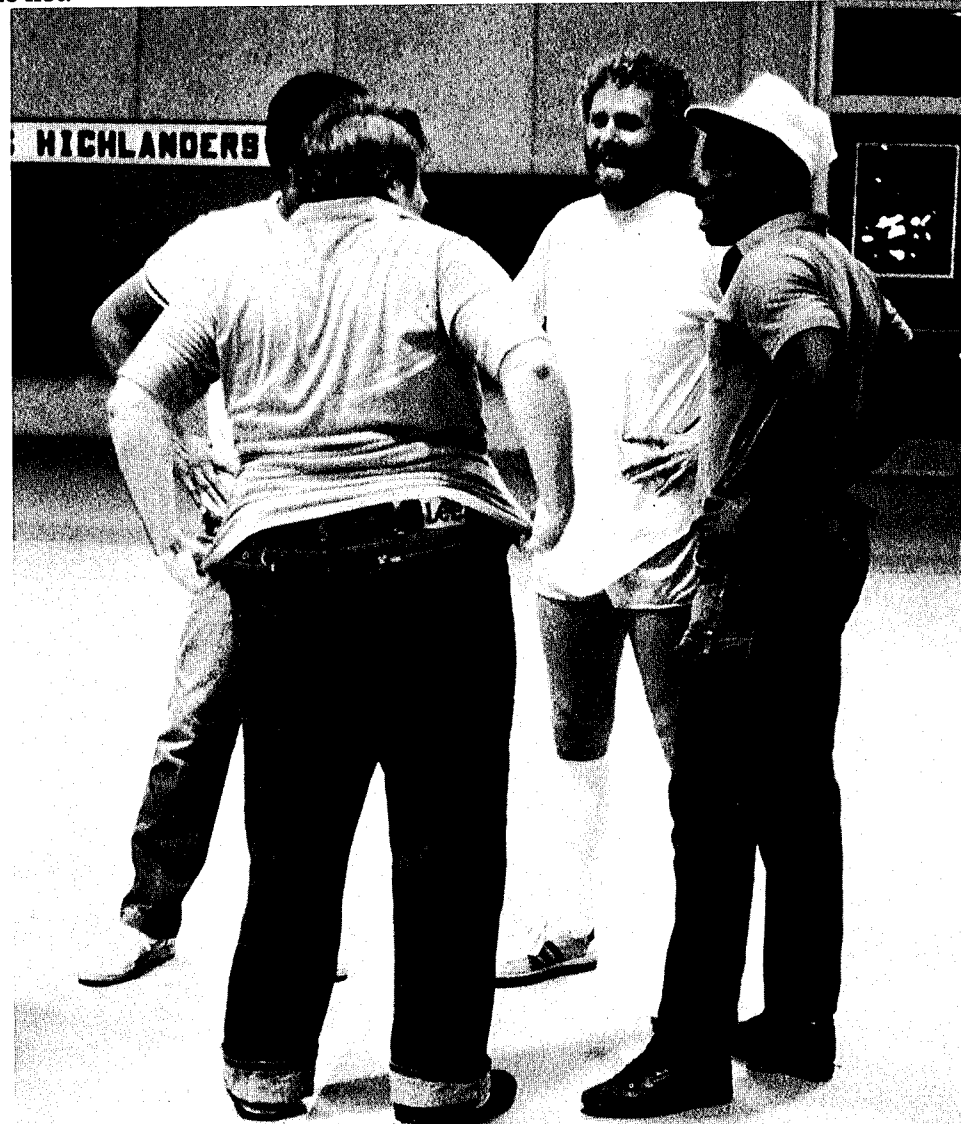

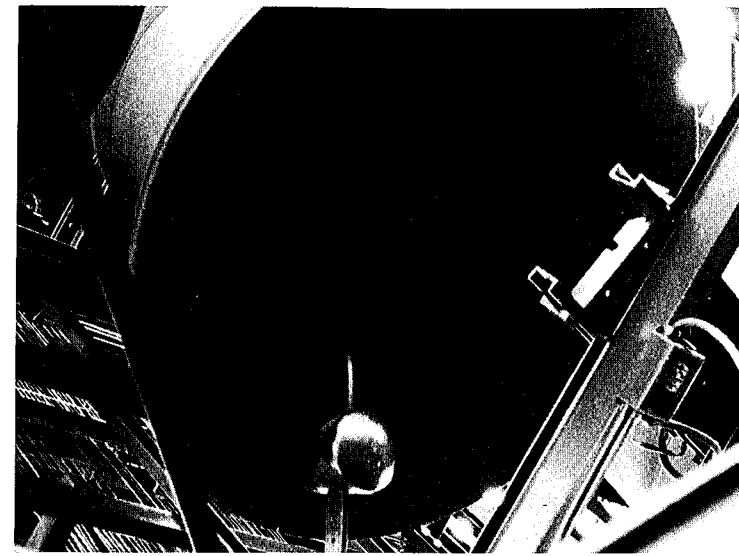

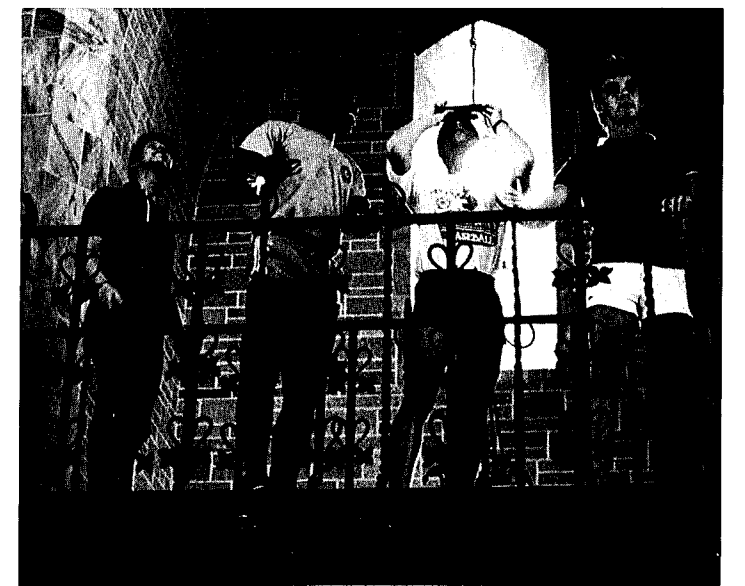

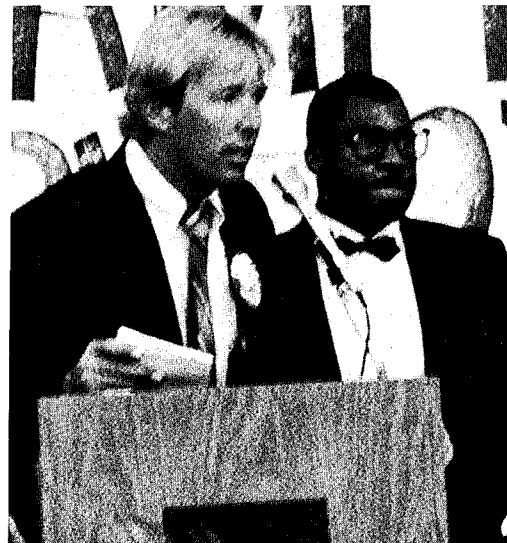

There's a monster under our beds. It can turn lovemaking into death-making. It can reveal the hidden price tag for what used to be called "free sex."

The monster is AIDS — acquired immune deficiency syndrome. Whether you believe in the monster or think that it's the result of overwrought imaginations may depend on where you live and whether you're included in one of the major risk groups.

Behind New York and California, Florida has the country's third-highest incidence of reported AIDS cases: 2,400 since June 1981, according to the Centers for Disease Control in Atlanta.

AIDS attacks the body's immune system, leaving it defenseless to an army of infections. Dying is never pretty, but an AIDS death is particularly ugly.

It is a wasting disease. No matter how much you eat, you lose weight. Or you have persistent pneumonia, persistent cough. Or you become somewhat demented and lose memory and neurological function.

The school hopes to have another show next year with as many talented students.



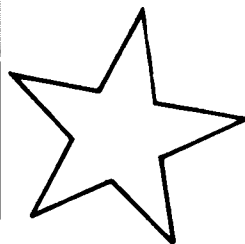

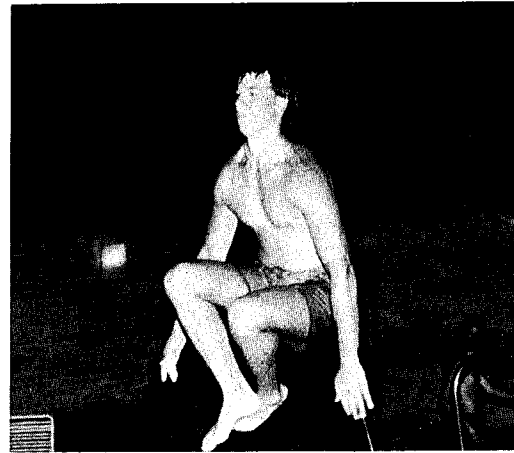

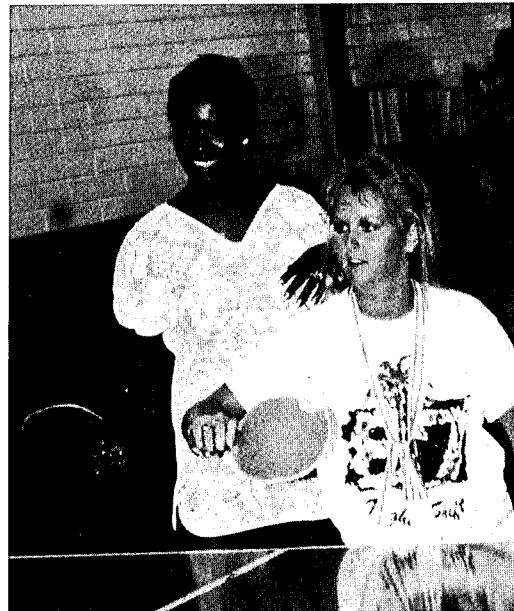
Night Shift '87: Never Say Goodbye

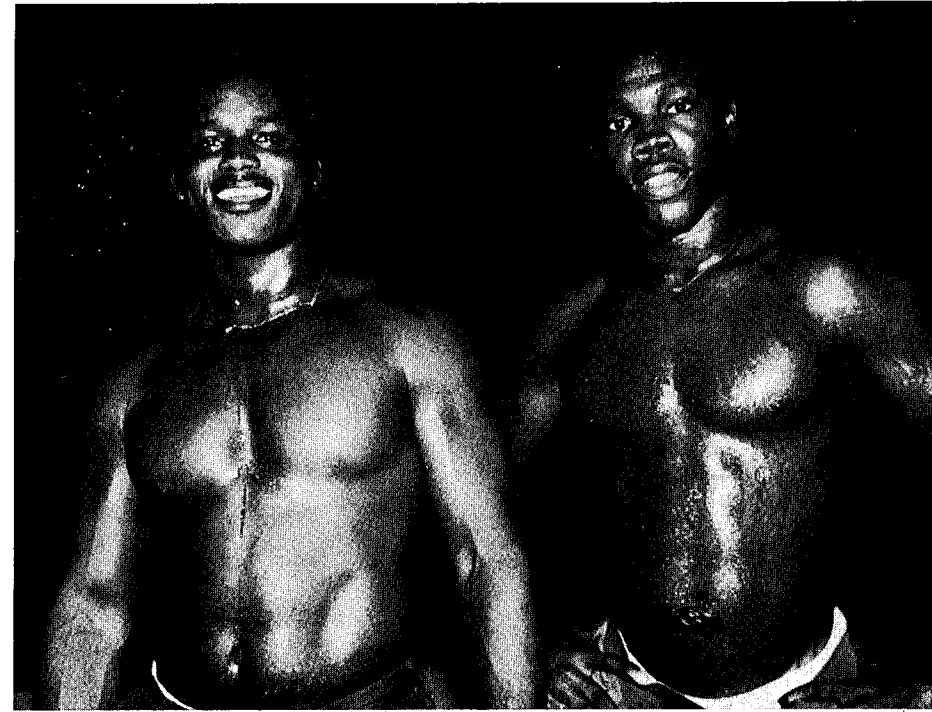

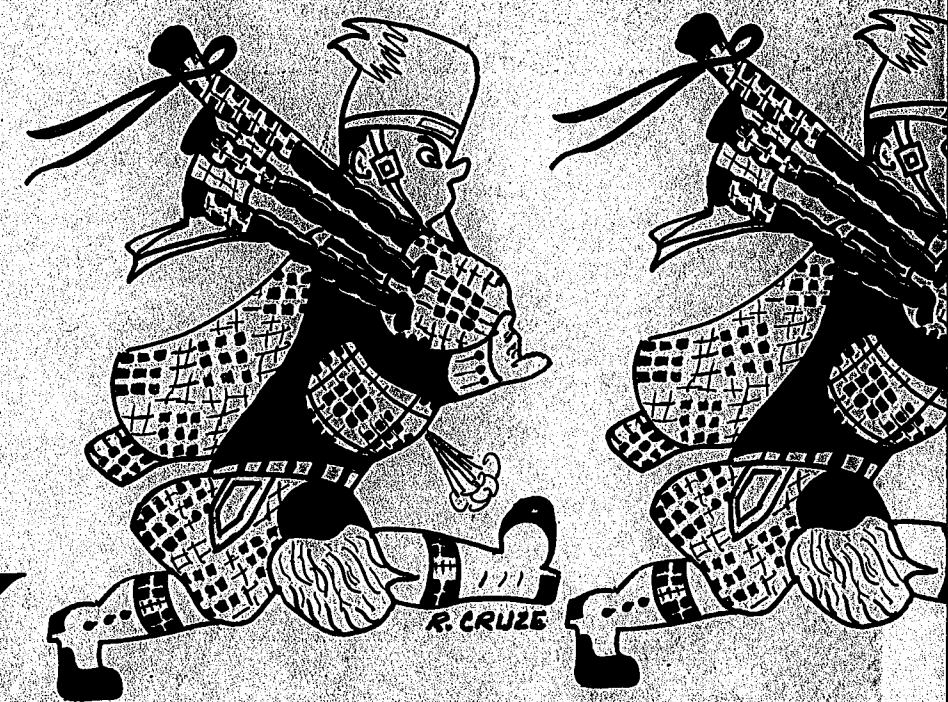
