CTE completers

With multiple measures an emphasis in recent years for evaluation of student learning, many of our courses have been rewritten. This has not only increased the number of A-G courses, but created additional CTE pathways where students can finish with a specific skill / certification. In 2018 there were 77 completers; 2019 had 276 completers of which 175 were seniors.

A-G course rewrites and submissions

S. Herrera shared that we want as many of our courses to be A-G as possible. This is good for the school and for students. In 2018-19, of the 15 new courses approved, PV gained 5 and was responsible for 3. In 2019-20, of the 20 new courses approved, PV was responsible for 15 and gained 16. Staff were commended for always making the extra effort in this process. Data is always considered.
