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








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RIVERVIEW EXCELLENCE: LAURA MARGOLF HONORED BY Y98'S BRET & JULIE

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Margolf was nominated by Vandeesha Lee, the parent of one of

Margolf not only called 9–1–1, but she rode with the ill scholar in the ambulance to the hospital to ensure that he was with someone he knew. Margolf then stayed with the scholar and his family at the hospital until he was discharged later that night.

[Ms. Margolf] is very helpful, caring, loving, respectful...she just loves to help anybody out that's in trouble," stated Lee. "I love Ms. Margolf for that. She's a wonderful teacher."

For going above and beyond the call of duty, Margolf received a \$500 gift card from Y98 and Vantage Credit Union.

True to her selfless nature, Margolf will donate the funds to Gibson Elementary School to help purchase new playground equipment.



It has been a joy to see the smiling faces and joyous laughter of our returning scholars. The start of the 2022–2023 school year has been a positive one. The



Safety continues to be a primary focus of the Riverview Gardens School District. Active shooter training is currently underway for all faculty and staff. RGSD continues to work with our District security personnel and our local law enforcement partners to review and adapt our security protocols to ensure that RGSD continues to provide a safe learning environment.

The District will require photo ID badges for all scholars and staff for the current school year. The ID badges are expected to be completed and in the hands of scholars by October 1. Badges will be provided free of charge and must be displayed around the scholar's neck or attached to their backpack at all times during the school day. IDs will also be required on school buses. However, if a scholar forgets or loses their ID, they may still go to school, but must immediately report to the office for a temporary or replacement ID.

Additionally, RGSD will begin sending text message alerts to parents who wish to be notified of important information and emergency updates. Text message alerts are optional, and will only be sent to parents who opt-in to the notification system. We encourage all parents to sign up for text message notification so that you may receive timely updates regarding school closings, utility outages, emergency situations or important District- or school-related news. <u>Click here</u> to register for RGSD text messages.

RGSD is committed to reviewing and revising the District's bullying policies, procedures and practices to ensure that every school can feel safe and comfortable in school. However, it will take a collaborative effort by the school district, parents and scholars to combat bullying.

Bullying behavior occurs on social media, at home, in the community and in schools. We encourage parents to monitor their children's social media activity to ensure that your children are not victims or perpetrators of bullying behavior.

If you believe your child is a victim of bullying, please speak with your child's teacher, counselor, principal or other school/district personnel to make a report.

Once the District receives a report of bullying, an investigation will begin within two days and a report will be completed within 10 days. RGSD has several supports and resources in place to help scholars and their families address bullying.

Lastly, I hope to see the entire RGSD community come out on Oct. 1 for the Homecoming festivities. We are proud to support the Riverview Gardens High School Rams as they face off against the Normandy Vikings on Oct. 1. We will celebrate our Rams pride with a parade through the area, beginning at the RGSD transportation depot, located at 807 Chambers Road at 10AM. The parade will end at Riverview Gardens High School, where we will root our mighty Rams to victory!
