Dear Parishioners,

Last week, I received word that my spiritual director had died. I have been privileged to have had him the last 14 years, and there were 4 years before that (he had been reassigned in St. Louis 5 years in between), meaning I had him for 18 of my 29 years of having a Spiritual director. That is a long time! He had a major accident a few months ago, but in addition had a blood disorder. He was 77. He leaves a big hole in my life, and so I know that there are many others, especially the staff of the Christ the King Retreat Center where he served as director for many of those same years, who are more impacted. Please join me in praying for him – Fr. Jim Deegan, rest in peace.

With that, I will be searching for a new director, and have a few leads already. As I do so, I realized that in reality, there are few solid options for priests, and perhaps fewer for laity. Some programs focus on less-than Christian traditions or dabble in New Age mysticism. A good, Catholic director is a rare find, but thankfully becoming more common. As a priest, I would always seek another priest for direction, and I would desire that while I do not mind being known to the director, there is a potential of conflicts of interest on either person if it were a priest of our diocese. As I have been, I will continue to schedule direction, when I find a director, on Mondays because I am sure that I will be required to travel a little more to find a good director.

This weekend, we kick off our Sunday FIRE with a movie on the angels. Yes, we believe in angels – both the guardian angels that each of us enjoy, but also the archangels, along with the other choirs of angels. OCTOBER 19: Some say that I am not a real person yet, that only my mother exists. But I am a real person, just as a small crumb of bread is yet truly bread. My mother is. And I am.

OCTOBER 23: My mouth is just beginning to open now. Just think, in a year or so I shall be laughing and later talking. I know what my first word will be: MAMA.

OCTOBER 25: My heart began to beat today all by itself. From now on it shall gently beat for the rest of my life without ever stopping to rest! And after many years it will tire. It will stop, and then I shall die.

NOVEMBER 2: I am growing a bit every day. My arms and legs are beginning to take shape. But I have to wait a long time yet before those little legs will raise me to my mother's arms, before these little arms will be able to gather flowers and embrace my father.

NOVEMBER 12: Tiny fingers are beginning to form on my hands. Funny how small they are! I'll be able to stroke my mother's hair with them.

NOVEMBER 20: It wasn't until today that the doctor told mom that I am living here under her heart. Oh, how happy she must be! Are you happy, mom?

NOVEMBER 25: My mom and dad are probably thinking about a name for me. But they don't even know that I am a little girl. I want to be called Kathy. I am getting so big already.

DECEMBER 10: My hair is growing. It is smooth and bright and shiny. I wonder what kind of hair mom has?

DECEMBER 13: I am just about able to see. It is dark around me. When mom brings me into the world it will be full of sunshine and flowers. But what I want more than anything is to see my mom. How do you look, Mom?

DECEMBER 24: I wonder if Mom hears the whispering of my heart? Some children come into the world a little sick. But my heart is strong and healthy. It beats so evenly: tup-tup, tup-tup. You'll have a healthy little daughter, Mom!

DECEMBER 28: Today my mother killed me.

Other completed projects are the sidewalks around the Knights' Hall, the four entrances to the Knights' Hall were replaced with gabled roofs, and the steeple has been repaired.

The Capital Campaign financial goal was \$1,396,750. As of November 2020, there was \$670,513 pledged/committed. That is 48% of the total goal. There is still \$726,235 needed to complete all of the listed projects. In the coming weeks you may be contacted to see what you have prayerfully decided to commit to these projects.

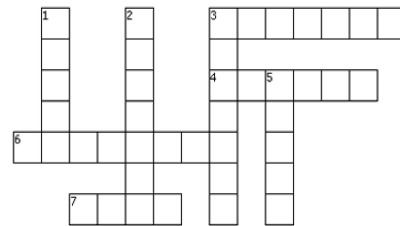
