Students in grades 3rd and 4th conducted their winter water testing at Winolequa park on 2/16. They conducted five different tests looking at a variety of things including dissolved oxygen and turbidity levels looking to see if the water would be healthy for salmon. The test results showed very healthy water!





Students will be taking this new knowledge with them as

they head to the Student Green Conference in March where they will have the opportunity to share their results with scientists and students from around Western Washington.

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### TK and Kindergarten Mrs. Tinnin

Kindergarteners are done with subtraction and started learning about teen numbers. They will focus on groups of ten and add to that as they learn the teen numbers.

In reading, kindergarteners learned the 'sh', 'ch', 'qu', 'ng', and 'th' sounds. They will continue practicing writing and reading words with those sounds. They are excited about the new reader <u>Seth</u>.

TK is finished reading about Thumbelina. They made a craft to help them act out parts of the story. TK also started their new unit learning about habitats. So far, TK has learned the letters in their name, M, A, T, D, and O.

In math, TK is learning about the number 10. They are also working with number 5 and how it relates to the other numbers.

Next Friday our read-a-thon begins! Be on the lookout for reading logs. All students can participate.

#### Third and Fourth Grade Classroom Mrs. Mars

Students had fun this last week going to Winolequa Park to do our second round of water testing! They will be putting all their water testing data together to prepare for their presentation at the GREEN Congress in March.

In class both grades are working hard to deepen their understanding of fractions. The fourth graders are learning how to multiply fractions. In ELA students spent the week going over a previously written essay. They learned to peer review with classmates and to point out both the strengths and areas of improvement. They then used this information to rewrite their essays taking into account the feedback they received in order to improve their writing.

In art students had fun making 3-D faces.

As we begin to wrap up the month of February and gear up for March's Read-a-Thon, it would be much appreciated if families could go on a book hunt at home. ### Fifth and Sixth Grade Classroom Mr. Burlingame

In ELA we have continued our read through of Bud, Not Buddy. We are also learning all about the Great Depression and connecting that period of history to the book. We will also be looking at several speeches that all connect together.

The 5th grade has started a quick chapter in math on dividing fractions. Next, they will be looking at numerical patterns and graphing data. The 6th grade is continuing a three chapter series on algebra and solving equations.

We have finished learning about the revolutionary war and have started learning about the inner workings of our constitution. I have a great resource that we will be using that breaks down the constitution and explains why each section is important.
