What is a credit?

- A credit is earned by passing a course with a D (60) or above!
 - A full semester course = 1 credit
 - A half semester course = 0.5 credit
- All students have the opportunity to earn **32 credits** while at FCHS.
 - A student **MUST** earn a minimum of **28 credits to graduate**.
- If a student does not earn a credit the first time they take a course, they may be required to retake the course in order to remain eligible for graduation.

What are the requirements for graduating high school?

ALL students MUST complete the following to receive a high school diploma:

FOUR credits in English

FOUR credits in Math

THREE credits in Science

THREE credits in Social Studies

ONE-HALF credit in Personal Finance

ONE-HALF credit in Economics

ONE-HALF credit in U.S. Government

ONE credit in Wellness

ONE-HALF credit in Physical Education

ONE credit in Fine Arts*

TWO credits in Foreign Language*

THREE credits in one Elective Focus area

ONE credit in Computer Science

ADDITIONAL COURSES required to equal a minimum of 28 Credits

* Fine art and foreign language requirements can be waived but must be taken for admission into a university after high school.*

What is an elective focus?

- An elective focus allows a student to focus in an area of study they might want to pursue beyond high school.
- Students will complete an elective focus of at least **3 credits** in sequential order.
- If the elective focus is Math, Science, or Fine Arts, these 3 credits will be <u>above and beyond</u> the required courses needed for graduation.
- We have various certification/credential opportunities for students through our CTE (Career and Technical Education) courses!

Graduating with Honors

Franklin County High School Honors Scholar Criteria:

Minimum grade point average of a 4.0 (weighted)

AND

Must have taken and earned a credit in at least twelve (12) academic honors courses

FCHS Valedictorian Determination:

Highest Grade Point Average (weighted)

12 or more Honors Courses

Graduate with Tennessee Honors

FCHS Honors Scholar

FCHS Salutatorian Determination:

Second Highest Grade Point Average (weighted)

12 or more Honors Courses

Graduate with Tennessee Honors

Types of Honors Courses Offered at FCHS

Standard Honors Courses

- Ex. Honors English I, Honors Chemistry, etc.
- Entrance into honors courses is determined by having a minimum of a B average, scoring at least "on track" or "mastered" on your 2024-2025 TNReady TCAP, earning a satisfactory score on the ExactPath assessment, and teacher recommendation

Statewide Dual Credit (SDC) Courses

- Provides the difficulty of honors courses, but with the opportunity to earn college credit by passing the Challenge Exam at the end of the course.
- Entrance to these courses is determined by successful prerequisite completion (prerequisites vary by course).

Dual Enrollment (DE) Courses

- A student is enrolled at **BOTH** FCHS and a post-secondary institution (Motlow or TCAT), earning the student college and high school credit upon satisfactory completion of the registered course.
- Entrance is determined by ACT score and a minimum high school GPA of 3.0.

Advanced Placement (AP) Courses

- Advanced level courses that are taught in-person by FCHS staff or online through AP Access for All/Niswonger.
- Students have the opportunity to earn post-secondary credit by taking the AP exam given in the Spring. Acceptable cut-off scores vary by post-secondary institution.
- Entrance is determined by a minimum GPA of a 3.0, and being a student in good academic standing.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: How do I communicate with my child's teacher?

A: The best way to communicate with your child's teacher is via email. Teachers' email addresses can be found on the FCHS website under "Staff."

Q: Where does my child check in if he/she enters school after 8:00 a.m.?

A: Students who arrive late are required to check in with attendance located at the back of the school by the gym lobby entrance.

Q: How do I check my child out of school prior to 2:30?

A: Students are required to check out with attendance located at the back of the school by the gym lobby. Checkouts are not permitted after 2:30 p.m.

Q: Does FCHS offer tutoring services?

A: Yes, there is a homework hotline available through the Tennessee Department of Education (615-298-6636). Additionally, FCHS offers Afternoon Academic Assistance (AAA) in English and math on most Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:15-4:15 p.m. Your child may check the AAA schedule posted in the stairwells or the school website.
