Dear Parishioners,

This Friday, we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints, a Holy Day of Obligation. It gives us a chance to thank and praise God for the holy people who have gone before us, modeling a life lived for Christ. Some are known to us, recognized by the Church in a formal way. Most are perhaps unknown, those who simply did the will of God without fanfare.

I think that the case could be made that those are the ideal saints – the ones who could tell our Lord, I simply did what was demanded of me, I am otherwise a worthless servant, as our Lord would hint. In that number, perhaps our deceased loved ones are counted. Perhaps even some of our loved one's enemies, fully reconciled to the Lord and others. Heaven will be a shock – we might be surprised by those that made it, but then again, they might be surprised we made it too!

Saturday is All Souls Day. I will offer a Mass at noon, in the manner of a typical daily Mass with no servers (if a lector is planning on attending, please volunteer). This day gives us a reminder to pray for all the deceased, because while we would hope that all our loved ones are already in heaven, we cannot be assured of that.

Some may still need our prayers, because they still have either a disordered attachment to earthly things, or that they are in need for more reparation before entering eternal rest. They are in purgatory, a state of purification. While we do not see this explicitly expressed in Scriptures, we hear hints. Our Lord speaks of those thrown into prison until they pay the last cent (there is not punishment or incompleteness in Heaven, and there is no release from Hell).

St. Paul speaks of a judgement that waits for all, that their works will be judged, and some will be saved as through fire. Thank God for this state — without it for those not yet ready for heaven due to the lack of reparation or attachments are given what is needed to prepare.

Regarding reparation, consider the analogy of a broken window – our sorrow may be real, and the forgiveness by the owner might be authentic, but the window is not repaired yet. Reparation repairs and restores. Regarding the disordered attachments, do we love God above all things? If not, we are not prepared for heaven. Disordered attachments compete for our love of God.

Regarding that attachment, perhaps this is a good thing to consider as we prepare for the election next week. Do we seek the good of all above the love of a political party? Do we simply vote based on the initial behind the politician's name, or do we research their policies and statements, and vote for hose that will support or at least not be opposed to what we believe best for society (pro-life stances, fiscal prudence, care for those in need, etc.)

REFLECTION ~ Think about this ...

The Church teaches us that to receive Holy Communion, we must be in a state of grace. But by faithfully participating in the Eucharistic liturgy and receiving Holy Communion, the Lord forgives our venial sins.

Some clear ways in which we are presented with this opportunity during the Mass are the Kyrie, when we repeat, "Lord, have mercy"; the Our Father, as we pray "forgive us our trespasses"; the Agnus Dei, when we intone, "Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us"; and when we receive Holy Communion. Pray them with devotion and contrition to receive our Lord more worthily.

Sin is what degrades you, not what the world deems lowly.

Let us pray.

Lord, you lowered yourself to an astonishing degree for our well-being. Increase in us the love that leads to eternal life so that we may be quick to serve those closest to us. We ask this in your most holy name. Amen.

THE BOOK OF THE DEAD


