It is hard to believe that the 3rd Quarter has ended, and June 6th will be here before we know it. We are transitioning into the testing part of the year. Our Kindergarten through 5th graders took their spring i-Ready Diagnostic Reading and Math Assessments before Spring Break. Our 3rd-5th graders will take the SC Ready ELA and mathematics assessments, and 4th graders will take the SC Ready science assessment starting the second week of May. The Guidance Department will send the State Assessments Schedule home later this month.

Registration for new and returning students for the 2024-2025 School Year will be ON-LINE this year. Pre-Kindergarten registration for children who will be 4 years old on or before September 1, 2024, will continue through Friday, May 31st. Packets can be picked up in the front office, if needed.
