You may have noticed a stronger presence from Amazon within Bessemer City Schools. That's due to an important partnership aiming to support our district and student learning. Since this summer, Dr. Renee Holley has been working steadfast with Amazon to implement its National Future Engineers Program in Bessemer City Schools.

Students can take advantage of three components of the program:

- 1. Explore provides introductory computer science activities to K 12 classrooms.
- 2. Learn offers Computer Science courses utilizing Amazon's curriculum partners. There is also an annual Teacher of the Year Award.
- 3. Build is a wonderful opportunity for our high school students. Amazon selects 100 high school seniors to receive a \$40,000.00 college scholarship if the student majors in Computer Science. There is also a paid summer internship with Amazon.

We are rolling the program out in phases to ensure its success.
