# Trip to the Fish Hatchery

On Thursday, September 18th the Wildlife Management class went on a field trip to the Warrensburg Fish Hatchery where they were able to learn about the processes involved in hatching and raising fish for stocking in the region. Our guide shared information about the significant economic impact of stocking fish and the important role it plays in attempting to balance the ecosystem. It was a great opportunity to meet and interact with professionals who work day in and day out in an environmentally-focused field they love.

### Fun facts:

- •Fluorescent lighting kills fish eggs
- •Warrensburg Fish Hatchery releases between 60-80 thousand fish each year
- •In the wild only 1% of fish eggs survive
- •In the hatchery 85% of fish eggs survive
- •Warrensburg Fish Hatchery raises and releases about 3,000 land-locked salmon into Lake George each year

Scholarship funding may be available, but is not guaranteed, and must be requested no later than October 17<sup>th</sup>.

Fill out and return the application to **Katy Smith at MCS with payment or the Town Hall**. Please be sure it is completely filled out and signed by parent/guardian. Checks should be made payable to the Town of Minerva. Applications are due back by **Friday, October 24, 2025.** \* Your child will not be enrolled in the program without full payment. \*

Parents of skiers in grades 3-6, or parents of new skiers/snowboarders <u>MUST BE PRESENT</u> or arrange for another parent to supervise their child. In addition, if your child does not advance with the rest of his or her group, you <u>must</u> continue to provide an individual ski/snowboard chaperone.

New this year, there will be an instructor-in-training lesson for children ages 13-18 who are already in levels 4-5 and are interested in a potential path working at Gore in their future. This advanced class will be available during lesson time.

It is important that kids come prepared for program. They should bring a lunch & snacks, warm clothing, helmet, hat, mittens/gloves & a scarf. A spare pair of dry gloves/mittens is highly recommended. Please contact Katy Smith to have your child/children fitted for equipment at the school.
