Evaline Highly Capable Annual Notice:

WAC 392-170 requires that all school districts identify and serve their most highly capable kindergarten through grade 12 students and provide them a continuum of services.

WAC 392-170-035 defines highly capable students as "students who perform or show potential for performing at significantly advanced academic levels when compared with others of their age, experiences, or environments. Outstanding abilities are seen within students' general intellectual aptitudes, specific academic abilities, and/or creative productivities within a specific domain. These students are present not only in the general populace, but are present within all protected classes according to chapters 28A.640 and 28A.642 RCW."

In accordance with WAC 392-170-060, WAC 392-170-075, and WAC 392-170-070 the Evaline School District uses multiple criteria, universal test measures, and a Multi-Disciplinary Selection Committee (MSC) to identify students who fall generally in the top 10 percentiles for cognitive ability.

Also, in accordance with WAC 392-170-045, Evaline has a referral process by which parents and teachers can provide further insight to the aptitudes and abilities of a child who they wish to recommend for highly capable services. Nomination forms can be found in our school office and can be e-mailed or mailed upon request. The open nomination window is from May 23rd, 2022 to June 3rd, 2022.

All students who attend Evaline in grades kindergarten through sixth will have the opportunity to be universally screened for highly capable services using multiple criteria and results from the Cognitive Ability Test (CogAT). Students who test in the top 10th percentile will be automatically referred to the MSC to determine whether they qualify for highly capable services.

In accordance with WAC 392-170-076 the Evaline School District has written procedures for appeal.





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
Kindergarten


In the afternoons we spent some time getting out plants in the garden now that we finally had a break in the weather!

Point Defiance Zoo and Aquarium Field Trip Details and Updates



We are SO excited to be restoring the traditional end of the year educational field trip for all of your students, on Tuesday, June 7th. We will be sharing updates each week until the trip occurs with any new or important information through various methods including newsletters, emails, and handouts. We are excited to have this opportunity for our students to showcase the hard work they have done this year regarding learning more about being students of character, as they demonstrate the use of character traits on this field trip in their multi age assigned groups, such as this month's focus on Cooperation, or our past traits of Respect, Honesty, Kindness, and Perseverance.

#1 Times: The bus is scheduled to leave promptly at 8:35AM. Please make sure your student either catches the bus or is dropped off prior to a regular school start (8:30AM) so we can directly reload the bus, take attendance, and leave on our adventure. We should arrive at the Zoo at 10AM. We are scheduled to leave the zoo at 2:15pm and have a return time of approximately 4pm (1 hour later than our normal dismissal time.) Our lead staff person on the bus will notify the school when passing Exit 79 (Walmart) and the office will send an email at that time with a tentative arrival time.

#2 Lunches: The school will provide delicious sack lunches for all students/chaperones who request one - it will be a peanut butter & jelly sandwich with juice box, and some delicious and fun side items. **In order for us to know how many lunches to make, please return the attached slip prior to next Friday (5/27/22)**

#3 Attire: Please have your students wear their **Blue Evaline shirts** if possible. If you would like to purchase a new one, or have any questions about these shirts please contact the school office for more information, or regarding alternative choices if one is not available. Have your student dress in layers as we can not predict how the weather will be for the entire day, including a **jacket or sweatshirt with hood and good walking shoes**, as they will be doing a lot of walking.

#4 Money / Gift Shop: This year we will be trying something new and **we will not be having groups end the field trip by going to the gift shop**. This way they will get more time seeing actual exhibits and no one needs to worry about keeping track of money. However, we know everyone wants a souvenir when they attend an awesome end of the year field trip, so **we are very thankful to the Evaline Booster Club for offering to provide zoo themed goodie bags for each student, as well as zoo themed snacks and the paw drawstring backpacks the students will each be given to use and keep that day**. So please do not send any money with your student, as it will not be needed and therefore the school staff will not be responsible for it.

#5 Technology: Please leave all recreation related technology devices at home. If a student already routinely brings a phone to school per your guidance, they may still bring it on the trip if you prefer, but it must be kept in their backpack as it is at school, and only gotten out with teacher permission, with the understanding that the school is not responsible for any damage to or loss of a phone which may occur.

#6 Chaperones: We will be using staff members as our primary chaperones for this event. However, **we have room for a limited number of additional chaperones, whose tickets we will pay for, and will fill these positions with the use of a Lottery system** due to the amount of interest we anticipate. **Whether or not you have already shared an interest in being a chaperone, we are asking all interested individuals to fill out the attached slip to be entered into the lottery in order to be fair and equitable. The potential chaperones will be pulled Monday 5/23/22 at 3pm** as well as an alternate, with notices going out from the office by Tuesday at 3pm. A **background check** will be required and will be handled through the district office. Parent/ Guardian chaperones will need to provide their own transportation to and from the zoo as the bus is full, and no additional family members can accompany them in this position as a chaperone. **Chaperones will assist, but not take the place of the staff member in charge of the group assigned, and will be placed where needed, and not necessarily with their own students.** Chaperones must take direction from the staff in the group they are assigned to. Should chaperones choose to stay at the zoo longer and visit additional areas of the zoo after the bus leaves, including the gift shop, that is their choice as they are on their own time.

#7 Bus: All students will ride the bus to the zoo with their teachers. Students can be checked off the bus before it leaves from the zoo to go home, if a parent / guardian is present. Students will have assigned seats and must follow all Bus rules. Students may bring a book to read on the bus. Staff will provide a few simple activities students may do during the ride.


