Cook County School's Goals

All schools in the district will

- The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on Georgia Milestones English Language Arts and Georgia Milestones Math End of Grade assessments will increase by 5 percentage points

COOK MIDDLE SCHOOL'S GOALS:

- The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on Georgia Milestones English Language Arts and the Math End of Grade assessments will increase by 5 percentage points by the end of May, 2023
- The percentage of students scoring at Proficient or above on Georgia Milestones English Language Arts and the Math End of Grade assessments will increase by 5 percentage points by the end of May, 2023

Teacher/School Responsibilities

Some of the key connections with families will be the following:

- Provide strategically chosen activities to be completed at home as explained and supplied during APTT meetings.
- Offer free APTT (Academic Parent Teacher Team) meetings three times a year with concentration on reading comprehension.
- Provide current curriculum maps for both ELA and math with a unit pacing guide for each unit
- Provide ELA and math learning videos via Google Classroom
- Communicate with parents and stakeholders in a variety of means: Newsletters, REMIND, carrycards, phone calls, emails, texts, etc.
- Monitor and report to parents students' Lexile score reported through Reading Growth Measure
- Monitor and report to parents students' basic math skills reported through Math Matters
- Focus on academic vocabulary in all academic subjects

Parent Responsibilities

- Monitor my child's independent reading and response in written form when requested.
- Assist my child in mastering lists of vocabulary words provided through effective strategies provided by the school.

- Assist my child in mastering the basic math skills appropriate for their grade level.
- Review my child's Lexile scores quarterly,
- Monitor their reading materials, and adjust materials as necessary
- Stay informed of my child's progress, my child's school activities and communicate with my child's teachers.
- Model the importance of reading with my child
- Try to attend APTT meetings in order to learn ways to increase my child's reading comprehension and vocabulary.

Student Responsibilities

- Work with my parents to master lists of vocabulary words provided by creating and studying flashcards
- Work with my parents to master grade level basic math skills by studying computational skills and facts.
- Read independently at appropriate Lexile level and respond in written responses when required.
- Maintain a reading log that includes Lexile score each quarter graphed to show my progress.
- Practice reading comprehension and vocabulary building on websites suggested by my teacher.
- Practice math skills presented in class by reviewing my notes and reworking problems nightly.
- Bring home all means of communication in a timely manner
- Know my Lexile level and set goals to read at or above my grade level Lexile band.
