- → Send home paper copies of leveled readers on individual student's reading level
- → Send home phonics and reading activities to support skill acquisition throughout the year
- → Send home iStation Reading and Math data to show student progress and discuss skill deficits
- → Send home individual sight word lists for mastery of high frequency words
- → Inform parents of opportunities to practice Math skills using iStation at home
- → Send home Go Math! practice resources

First grade teachers will:

- → Send home individual sight word lists for mastery of high frequency words.
- → Send home Saxon Phonics information to facilitate acquisition of reading foundational skills.
- → Send home Go Math! homework to provide resources for mastery of math grade-level standards.
- → Send home phonics and reading activities to build reading foundational skills and transition into reading fluency
- → Send home reading materials (library books, leveled readers, reading passages) with students to encourage a love for literacy
- → Send home iStation reading and math data to show student progress

Second grade teachers will:

- → Send home weekly newsletters and individualized notes based on student needs
- → Send home individual sight word lists for mastery of high frequency words
- → Send home reading fluency practice pages
- → Send home paper copies of leveled readers on the student's independent reading level
- → Send home phonics-based spelling lists
- → Send home math practice sheets to correspond with current skill
- → Send home math fluency sheets for addition/subtraction
