For this coming month our CC theme will be Rocks. We will look at different kinds of Rocks as well as walking out doors and collecting some rocks as well.


Our cultural lifeways in April falls in the month when we celebrate Easter. We will discuss our clans and the traditions that are practiced during this time of year.

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Reflect Back on March

Creative Curriculum: Shoes. Everyone has different types of shoes, with many different colors, pictures, and textures. We even compared the shoestrings, velcro, and the slip on shoes. I think the fun part was taking our shoes off for a short time. Thank you to those families who completed the activity that was sent home. Very creative.

Cultural Lifeways: Wild Celery and Onion picking. We didn't get the chance to go out and walk to see if we could find any wild celery or onions. With the weather still being cold or windy, and there wasn't much moisture. We did look at pictures of each, some kids did point out the flowers that were on the wild celery.

Conscious Discipline: Power of Will. Using our own words to tell others that we are playing with a certain toy; asking if we could have a turn with a toy. Trying to use our words versus taking toys away.

Health / Nutrition Activities: Leprechaun hats. Enjoying a little snack is always fun!

April

Creative Curriculum: Rocks. Yay, I think this is going to be one of the most fun times in school, our children love rocks! We will have the chance to go rock picking, feel the different textures, maybe get to add some color to the rocks with paint, and compare some sizes.

Cultural Lifeways: Easter Activities. Around this time is when we start to talk about our clans. We will have activities in the classroom using pictures of the clans, there will be an activity sent home for you all to make a poster using your child's clans. We will get to make some easter pudding and as always, some will be sent home for our families to try.

Conscious Discipline: Power of Intention. The goal is to help children reflect on how they feel about the consequence and the impact of their choices. It says, "Feel your feelings. Let your feelings guide you. You can handle this." This enables children to take personal responsibility for their actions and provides the intrinsic motivation to choose new, better strategies in the future. -Conscious Discipline Book

Health / Nutrition Activities: Yogurt parfaits. Again, another yummy treat that we get to all enjoy.

CHINATOWN CLASSROOM

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What We Learned

In March, we were able to introduce the idea of taking turns. Our centers included sensory bins, which are a big hit with young children. Due to limitations of size and materials, children were shown how to play in the center until the timer rings, showing that it is time to leave and play at another area. Reminders are needed to show when it is time to switch, but the children seem to understand that they can come back to play after a few minutes.

This month, our students are exploring rocks. Young children are naturally drawn to collect rocks, picking up different sizes, shapes, and textures. They will practice following limits and expectations that are related to going for walks to look for rocks: staying with the group and carefully choosing which rocks to pick up. Children will also interact with their friends by using and sharing tools and materials to explore rocks; such as, boxes, ramps, and magnifying glasses. They will be encouraged to carry their rocks carefully and develop balancing skills to hold containers and walk around objects.

Our kids will also have the chance to experience soil and its uses, which supports our rock study. An area outside the classroom will be prepared to allow our children to safely explore dirt with tools that may separate the soil from the pebbles or create a little mud kitchen to make mud pies. Children will be encouraged to safely use shovels and sifters/colanders all while learning how to take turns and share.

We, teachers in Paguate classroom are very happy and proud of your children learning the Keres language. Please, continue to encourage your child to say the Keres prayer during family meal times. Naming the colors and counting, along with naming basic items around the house. They, are also able to say our morning prayer to get our day started, knowing the direction to face, when asked. Simple daily basic Keres words are used daily. Ask your child what they are learning, continue using the language at home. What little you know is a lot for your child, to learn from.

For the remainder of the school year, as mentioned last month, we will be focusing on our letters, numbers and keep practicing our daily classroom safety rules, classroom routines, using and implementing our learning skills and getting ready for the next level of learning. The children are getting good with tracing their name, letters, shapes and numbers, along with recognizing. We, will also continuing practicing using our Creative Curriculum, Cultural Life Ways, and our Conscious Discipline.

The Creative Curriculum, we are going to be exploring with Recycling and for our STEAM is exploring Soil. Look out for the Classroom Calendar with fun Activities to do with your child this month. Cultural Life Ways, learning about Easter Activities.

Thank you, Parents/ Guardians, for sending your children back to school. We, are looking forward to an awesome finish. Thank you for your support from home, please continue to support your child when they have rough days. Weather is getting warmer, please dress your child according to the weather and encourage to drink lots of water. If not all ready, please send a water bottle for your child.



As far as being Laguna people, we should be more inclined to take care of our Mother Earth and those that occupy the land. With that in mind, we will discuss with the children what the importance of recycling is in our community and keeping it clean.

April will also bring us the holiday of Easter. As we all celebrate Easter in our own ways, here at the school we will celebrate by having a demonstration of how Easter Pudding is made on Wednesday, April 1st, at 10:30 am, and an Easter egg hunt on Thursday, April 2nd, at 11 am. We will also celebrate by recognizing our clans with each child. We will have no school on Friday, April 3rd, in honor of Good Friday.

Once again, thank you families for allowing us to be your child's teacher. It has been a great school year so far. We are looking forward to the end of school year activities including our annual field trip. Mrs. Pedro and I are discussing different destinations. If you would like to share a destination, please make contact with us here at the school.

Also, just as a reminder, in order to keep your children safe, please make sure the children are wearing the proper footwear. Closed toe shoes are required (sneakers and tennis shoes are recommended). IAW with the parent handbook, page 37, safety bullet #4, it states that, "Refrain from sending your child to school with hoodies with drawstrings, Crocs, flip-flops, sandals or open toed, wheels or heeled shoes." Running shoes are always the best here at school.

ENCINAL CLASSROOM

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Creative Curriculum: For April, the theme is seeds and will be for the whole month. Seeds are fascinating! They can be found in many places and come in many different shapes and sizes. Seeds make many major appearances in our everyday lives: we eat them, plant them, remove the fruits, grind them, harvest them, and use them to create art and music. Children will have opportunities to share their knowledge, examine seeds in new ways, and experiment with them.

Cultural lifeways: Children will learn to identify the different directions, recognize wild herbs in the community, and learn how these herbs are used. The children will learn the names of the ingredients used to make Easter pudding and help make some in the classroom.

Nutrition Activity: The children will be making yogurt parfaits for our nutrition activity this month. The children will learn that food fuel are bodies, promoting independence, and expanding their knowledge about the different food groups. The ingredients are:

- 1 cup of fresh fruit (strawberries, blueberries, raspberries, bananas, etc.)
- 1 cup low-fat or fat-free plain yogurt
- ½ cup low-fat granola

Student achievements/milestones: The children are recognizing the letter formation of the lower-case letters and the different line names: sky line, plane line, grass line, and worm line to write their first and last name.



The children have become independent in taking care of all their personal needs in the classroom without assistance from teachers.

Reminders to Parents:

- *PLEASE send your child in a light jacket because the weather is constantly changing, and we want them to be comfortable. PLEASE send a hat and a water bottle for the days that the sun is shining. We want them to stay hydrated.
- *Continue to check your child's bag/folder DAILY as notes are sent home and send the folders back as well.
- *Read to your child for at least 10-15 minutes. Don't forget to write it on their Reading Log! Reading to your child helps them recognize letters and words to help them read.


As we enter the month of April, I want to remind parents that you are welcome to come visit the center. There are a variety of volunteer opportunities available, just give us a call ahead of time.






Activities to Help Your Toddler Grow and Learn

Your toddler enjoys being with you and is learning new words very quickly. She is using her language more often to let you know her wants, needs, and ideas. She can carry on a simple conversation and may talk to herself or pretend to have a conversation with a stuffed animal. She can follow simple directions and loves to read books. She likes to hear the same book read over and over!



I Spy

You can play this in the car, on the bus, or on a walk. Say, "I spy with my little eye a green truck." Your child tries to find what you spied. Then it is his turn to spy something. Remember to spy things your child can see. You can also say, "I hear with my little ear..." Listen for sounds such as a motorcycle, a car horn, a bird singing, a dog barking, or a radio.

Picture Album

Make a little album with pictures of your child and the people and pets he knows. Have your child talk about the pictures and name the people and pets. Ask your child, "Who's that? What are they doing?" Look at this book over and over. Help your child learn to say her first and last name and write it on the album.

When You Were Little

Tell your child stories about when he was little: "When you were first born..." or "When you were a little baby..." Your child will love to hear these stories again and again.

Dinner Report

At the end of a busy day, let everyone talk about his or her day. Ask your child to tell the family what she did during the day. Let her take her time. You might remind her if she forgets some events. Soon she will learn to tell what happened in the right order. Say, "Thanks for telling us about your day!"

Washing a Baby

Let your child wash a baby doll in a plastic tub, or bring a baby doll into his bath. Name the doll's body parts as he washes the baby: "You're washing the baby's hands." Let your child know what a good job he is doing taking care of the baby.


What's that Sound?

Turn off the television and other electronics, and listen with your child to sounds around your home. Listen to the refrigerator motor, wind chimes, a clock ticking, or people talking. Ask your child to tell you what she hears. Try this at night. Listen for the night sounds of crickets, frogs, or cars beeping. Whisper to each other about what you hear.

Yogurt Parfaits NUTRITION ACTIVITY APRIL 15, 2026

Ingredients


- 1 cup fresh fruit (such as strawberries, bananas, blueberries, or raspberries)
- 1 cup low-fat or fat-free plain yogurt
- ½ cup low-fat granola (optional)

Directions

1. Wash and dry the fruit. If needed, slice the fruit into bite-size pieces.
2. Put ¼ cup of the yogurt in the bottom of two small glasses.
3. Sprinkle 1 tablespoon of the granola over the yogurt in each glass.
4. Put ¼ cup of the sliced fruit over the granola in each glass.
5. Repeat the layers.

Makes 2 servings
