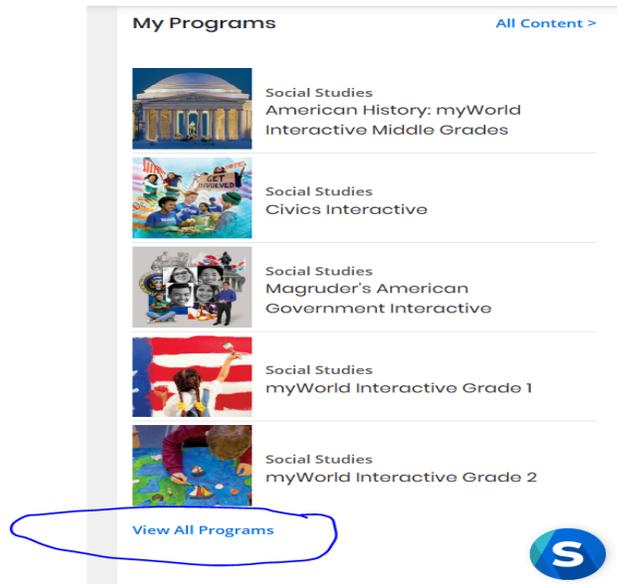

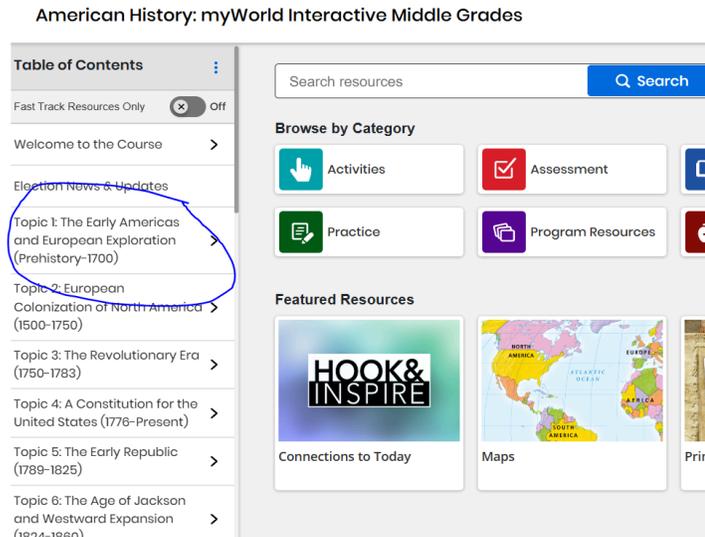
- On this landing page, click on the “View All Programs” icon in the lower right hand corner. It will take you to another landing page with different text options. Screenshot below.
