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Course Description:

Agriscience is an introductory laboratory science course that prepares students for biology, subsequent science and agriculture courses, and postsecondary study. This course helps students understand the important role that agricultural science and technology plays in the twenty-first century. In addition, it serves as the first course for all programs of study in the Agriculture, Food, & Natural Resources cluster. Upon completion of this course, proficient students will be prepared for success in more advanced agriculture and science coursework. This course counts as a lab science credit toward graduation requirements.

Class Design

The three main parts of an Agriculture program are class/ lab activities, FFA, and SAE (Supervised Agriculture Experience). The classroom and lab are where students will learn and apply basic knowledge and concepts. FFA activities will provide opportunities to develop leadership skills, explore interests, compete in career development events if the student chooses to do so, and broaden horizons. The SAE allows students to take learning to the next level, take ownership, and perfect problem solving skills. Students are required to carry out a SAE. This project is chosen by the student and must be related to agriculture. There will be more detailed information given on this at a later date.

Classroom Rules:

- 1. Be respectful (yes ma'am, no ma'am)(yes sir, no sir)
