In accordance with the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act and Pennsylvania Act 24 of 2021 (Act 24), the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) will award approximately \$50,000,000 or one percent (1%) of Pennsylvania's ARP Elementary and Secondary School Education Relief (ESSER) State Reserve funds to support school districts, charter schools and cyber charter schools (collectively, LEAs) in the development and implementation of comprehensive after-school programs to address learning loss in response to the academic, social, emotional and mental health needs of students and subgroups of students impacted by COVID-19 public health emergency that supplement school programs and activities.

This plan is part of a consolidated application that includes after-school programming, summer programming, and a comprehensive plan to address learning loss. Below is a listing of the subgrant allocations and a summary of the plan for uses:

ARP ESSER After School Set Aside

Allocation: \$47,200

Period of Availability: March 13, 2020 – September 30, 2024

Funds will be utilized primarily to pay for hourly compensation of applicable staff administering the after school tutoring program for identified students beginning in January 2022 through May 2024. A portion will also be set aside for the potential cost of providing snacks to students utilizing the program.

ARP ESSER Summer School Set Aside

Allocation: \$47,200

Period of Availability: March 13, 2020 – September 30, 2024

Funds will be utilized primarily to pay for transportation services for students attending summer learning academy programs beginning in June 2021 through July 2024. A portion will also be set aside for instructional supplies and the potential cost of providing snacks to students utilizing the program.

ARP ESSER Learning Loss Set Aside

Allocation: \$236,002

Period of Availability: March 13, 2020 – September 30, 2024

Funds will be utilized to extend Child Behavioral Specialist services through the Mercer County Behavioral Health Commission for the 2022/2023 and 2023/2024 school years, implementation of a social and emotional curriculum which includes the associated supplies and necessary professional staff development and the assessment materials, instructional supplies and professional development to support targeted reading instruction.
