Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan

Southern Local Schools is committed to creating a safe environment for student learning. District personnel worked with the local health department, county educational service center, school based mental health providers, Director of Special Education and related service, and the school community to develop the following plan for returning to in-person learning and the continuation of services for our students and families. Facilities-Southern Local Schools is currently working to upgrade air ventilation systems to allow for better filtration and flow within the buildings and other indoor facilities. All restroom facilities will be upgraded to include touch less faucets, paper towel dispensers, faucets, and automatic flushing toilets. Additional busses are being purchased to allow for proper spacing during routes. Hand sanitizer will be available throughout the facilities. Custodial staff will continue to sanitize high touch areas frequently to decrease the opportunity for the spread of viruses and other communicable diseases.

Southern Local Schools Recommendations:

Mask Wearing- Southern Local Schools will follow recommended guidelines from the Columbiana County Health Department and CDC. In situations where social distancing is not possible, masks would be recommended but not mandatory.

Social Distancing- Social distancing is recommended in all settings including classrooms and common indoor spaces.

Hand Washing- All staff, students, and community members entering Southern Local facilities are encouraged to wash their hands frequently including prior to eating.

Tracing/Isolating/Quarantining- Southern Local will continue to follow CDC and Columbiana County Health recommendations related to support and care of ill staff or students. Any ill staff member or student will report to the nurse's station for care. Parents or Guardians of ill students will be contacted for next steps.

Southern Local Schools partnered with the Columbiana County Health Department to offer multiple opportunities for staff and students to be vaccinated during the 2020-2021 school year. Vaccinations of staff and students is not required. The district will continue to work with the county providers to offer vaccinations to those who are interested.

Extended Learning Opportunities and Identification of Learning Loss

School closures during the spring of 2020 and the 2020-2021 school year have created challenges with delivering instruction for students leading to learning loss. Southern Local Schools will have all students participate in quarterly benchmark assessments to identify areas of support needed for students. Teacher teams will meet monthly to plan and develop learning processes and strategies to address the identified areas of learning support needed. Progress monitoring will take place to track student progress and make learning process adjustments to meet student needs. Southern Local Schools will offer extended learning opportunities during June, and before or after school tutoring/interventions during the school year. All special education students will continue to receive both academic and related services.

Social Emotional and Positive Behavior Supports

Southern Local partners with multiple school based mental health providers to support student's mental health and has a certified school psychologist on staff. The mental health team will be formed in the fall of 2021 and will meet quarterly to review student data related to attendance, behavior, and health and wellbeing to provide supports where needed.

Staff members in grades PK-5 have been trained in PAX strategies to provide behavior supports for elementary students. Positive behavior supports for students

in grades 6-12 are currently being reviewed and revised to address areas of need related to attendance and behavior.

Meal Services

Southern Local will continue to provide FREE breakfast and lunch to all students as part of the district CEP status. The district is partnering with Nutrition Inc. beginning in the fall of 2021 to provide after school meals to students who are participating in after school programs and activities.

Southern Local will review the district plan semi-annually in January and August with the district team, community partners, parents, and students. District feedback surveys will continue to be posted on the district website to gather input throughout the year. Any revisions will take place following the review to ensure the plan is updated. Use of Funds:
ESSER/ARP ESSER

Funds provided through the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER) and the American Rescue Plan (ARP) will be used for the following purposes:

- Purchase of 2 new busses in order to update bus efficiency and space out students. This will also allow us to have less students on busses through rerouting processes with new busses available.
- Updating the building air handler systems to provide better efficiency and cleaner air allowing for proper air flow through the buildings.
- All bathroom facilities will be updated to include touch-less systems to reduce the spread of communicable diseases and COVID 19.
- Additional cafeteria tables will be purchased to allow for more efficient spacing of students will at breakfast and lunch.
- Full time subs will be employed to ensure that all classes are covered when teachers are out due to illness. If subs aren't utilized to cover a teacher's class for the day, they will serve as tutors to students who need additional practice with skills lost from being out of the classroom due to closures related to COVID.
- All buildings and busses will receive weekly high quality disinfection sprays and cleanings above and beyond the normal cleaning.
- Staff will provide virtual tutoring hours after school and on the weekends for students to join and get additional assistance with academics.
- An online academy will be started to allow students and families and online educational option if decided that is the best fit for that family. Some of our families have medical concerns and require online learning to prevent the contraction of communicable diseases such as COVID 19.
- A dedicated online facilitator will be hired to aid online families through the learning process to ensure the best possible outcomes.
- Supplies such as masks, plexiglass dividers, cleaning supplies, and building signage with processes displayed, thermometers, and face scanning temperature devices will be purchased to conduct processes for staff, students, and visitors to enter the buildings.
