
### Mr. Thomas J. Upshaw Assistant Principal




There were those memorable times, too, when we marched in school parades, with the flag waving before us, our majorettes leading us, and the sound of our band playing martial music.

There were those proud moments when we saw our rings for the first time, and realized all they meant to us. That pale blue stone, that gold mounting, and twelve years of memories...



The Card Catalog is kept up to date and is used daily by a large number of our students, and we will always remember how helpful were the people of the library force.




Every day finds us needing something from the school store. The paper for that theme, the paperback book for that report, the folder for that term paper all can be obtained here.
















