
# Meditation Begins Day for Interfaith Members





## Campus Chatter Free to Students






## Serviteens — Teens That Serve the Community

# Beacons Light Shines








## Key Club Wins Award





#### Media Visits Libraries







Your freshman class was definitely a plus to Lake Wales High School.




