

Dear Parishioners,

On January 22, we mark the 49th year of legalized abortion due to the Roe Versus Wade decision. This travesty of justice is one that I hope and pray will be corrected in this next year, that as we mark the 50th year, we can rejoice that as a nation we no longer have abortion enshrined as a right. Should the Supreme Court rule to reverse this decision, our work in Minnesota is not done – in fact it only gets harder as our state that not only allows abortion up to birth, but forces taxpayers to fund it through taxes. May the hearts of our politicians and those that support the taking of innocent life in the womb be turned to see the sanctity of life and work to preserve it. Abortion is a grave sin, as it intentional takes the life of an

Abortion is a grave sin, as it intentional takes the life of an innocent child in the most vulnerable of places. Nothing justifies the direct, intentional taking of life of the unborn. Some might be quick to point out the cases where the life of the mother and child are threatened, but this is not the vast number of cases women seek 'termination of pregnancy.'

While we lack the means of transferring the fetus in the case of an ectopic pregnancy, surgeons can attempt to (there is a principal of 'double effect' at play, they can intend a moral action – moving the implanted fetus from a dangerous spot – knowing that it might cause a negative effect that is not intended – cutting the fetus off from the mother thus killing it. Even in the case when the fetus is 'not compatible with life,' we are not morally permitted to kill the child. Some might point out, too, that there are other grave sins – child abuse being one – but abortion deprives a child of life, not only is it abusive itself.

The disregard for life at the beginning carries itself all the way through to the end of life. We see a disregard for the elderly, and a growing acceptance of euthanasia, and also a disregard for proper funeral services and respect for the deceased.

From the description of the third video of our Search Series: Today we seem to think we've moved beyond the idea of God, but this secular view of life is a very new and unusual idea to humanity. All through human history man has looked to something outside himself for the answers to life. Why have we given up on God? Do we think science has disproven Him? Do we think society is better off without him? We talk with astrophysicists, chemists, Harvard professors, and more to make the case that it's not only reasonable to believe in God, it's essential if you want to have a truly amazing life. Our souls seek their creator, and we'll never be truly happy unless

we seek Him out. As St. Augustine famously said, "You have made us for Yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in Thee."

Please note that next week we begin Catholic Schools Week and will not have Sunday FIRE, and the week following we will have Catechesis of the Good Shepherd for adults. For those who wish to catch up, here's your chance!
