Kindergarten

As we are now in the the 3rd quarter of the school year, please make sure your child is coming to school on time everyday. Attendance has been an issue for kindergarten. In order to have all our students meet their end of year goal, they must attend school on a daily basis. From now to the end of the year, we are working towards more independent work in class and we would like for that to transfer to homework as well. Students must be completing and writing their homework assignments on their own. Please be on the lookout for the end of year countdown papers that will be sent home this month. First Grade

February is a rigorous month for First Graders. In Math, the student will be learning the various aspects of measurement, place value, and applying their addition and subtraction skills to evaluate and solve problems. In English Language Arts (Reading), the students are expected to take on more responsibility for their own learning, such as reading directions on their own, composing and writing complete sentences, forming effective study habits. In Social Studies, we will explore maps and the physical features of the Earth. When your First Grader comes home exhausted, they have worked hard to grow their brains in preparation for 2 nd Grade.

Second Grade

Second grade is beginning to merge all subjects together for PYP. We are working on "How the World Works". We are focusing on change, causation, and connections.

For Reading students are working on the Author's purpose while incorporating weather, seasons, and the ways Earth changes. We are also incorporating Social Studies with these two subjects and learning how America changed with explorers entering our country and how it changed things for American Indians. In math we are learning fractions, time, and money. We are also always working on ways we can care for ourselves and others.

Fifth Grade

In Fifth Grade for the month of February in Math, students will be learning to add, subtract, multiply, and divide fractions. We are continuously practicing our math facts and encourage students and their families to practice them at home. In ELA, we are working on argumentative text, morphemic elements, and learning about what happened in the past and how it impacts the future. We are having weekly literature circles every Friday. Students should be reading at least 20 minutes a day and recording a summary in their reading logs. In Science and Social Studies, we are continuing our "Sharing the Planet" unit and learning what systems, processes, and resources impact humans, animals, plants, and other organisms. The students have recently completed an in-class "deep dive" project where they addressed real-life issues with critical thinking and background knowledge that they learned from class.

Why Offer Primary Years Programme (PYP) IB

How does the PYP foster a student's personal and social-emotional development?

The PYP promotes the development of a list of behaviors that we call the learner profile. The PYP supports children to become inquirers, thinkers, communicators, risk-takers, knowledgeable, principled, caring, open-minded, well-balanced and reflective. The PYP also lists attitudes to be developed in the children that will contribute to the student profile. These are: appreciation, commitment, confidence, cooperation, creativity, curiosity, empathy, enthusiasm, independence, integrity, respect, and tolerance.
