Gateway's Mill Creek Urban Farm Hosts "WaveMakers"
On OceanFirst's CommUNITY First Day



OceanFirst Bank branches and offices closed on Tuesday, September 12 to volunteer within the community for their CommUNITY First Day. Over 750 OceanFirst employees, known as WaveMakers, volunteered across five states.

A group of five WaveMakers arrived at Gateway's Mill Creek Urban Farm assist with farm activities such as picking and planting vegetables with direction from Marcus Weaver, Gateway's Director of Agriculture and Food Initiatives. Following their time on the farm, the group moved to Gateway's Emergency Assistance Food Pantry to pack bags. Galloway WIC Staff Come To The Rescue Of Baby In Peril



On Friday, September 22, Senior Program Nutritionist, Alyssa Williams, along with WIC Admin Clerk Yahaira Alvarez and WIC Clerk Aracelis Rodriguez, responded to an urgent situation at Gateway's WIC location in Galloway. When Williams heard a mother screaming in the waiting room that her newborn baby was not breathing, she sprang into action. While directing Rodriguez to call 911, she noticed that the baby was purple and trying to gasp for air. After removing the baby from the car seat, Williams performed infant CPR while following the direction of the 911 operator. Before long, the baby began breathing and crying, at which point Williams was able to stop CPR and allow police and EMS to take over. She remained by the mother's side as they walked out to the ambulance.

"Gateway salutes Alyssa Williams and her staff for their quick thinking and response in helping this baby and mother in their time of need," said Albert B. Kelly, Gateway's President and CEO. "What they did in an emotionally charged situation was amazing. Gateway is proud of you."

Gateway is honored to call Alyssa Williams, Aracelis Rodriguez, and Yahaira Alvarez our own, and their ability to remain calm in the face of an emergency while demonstrating empathy to those involved is incredibly admirable. They embody what it means to go above and beyond for those we serve.

Gateway WIC Services Available In Galloway Following Egg Harbor City Office Closure

Gateway Community Action Partnership operates the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants & Children (WIC) in Atlantic, Camden, Cape May, Cumberland and Salem counties. The program provides supplemental foods, nutrition education, lactation support, immunization education and health care referrals to income-eligible pregnant women, new mothers, infants and children up to age 5.

Effective September 28, 2023, the Egg Harbor City WIC office located at 300 Philadelphia Ave., Suite B, will no longer be in operation. However, Gateway WIC will continue to provide services to participants at the Galloway WIC Office at 333 Jimmie Leeds Road, Unit 5 (609-382-5050). The Galloway WIC Office maintains operating hours Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. WIC is an equal opportunity employer and provider.
