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Kindergarten

We are finishing up our first chapter in math comparing and writing numbers 0-5. We are also working on finding number pairs that equal each number. For example, number pairs for five are 1+4, 0+5, 2+3, 3+2 and so on.



We are also working on another math lesson in the afternoons. Students analyze different objects to tell how they are exactly the same or how they are similar. These are whole group activities and discussions.

Students are continuing to learn pre-reading skills. We are listening for the beginning, middle, and end sounds of short words. For example, fish- "f", "i", "sh". You can work with your child by asking them to identify the first and last sounds in words.

First and Second Grade Explorers

This week's thematic study was centered around fire safety. If you have a moment to practice and talk through evacuation procedures for your family in case of emergency, it would be appreciated. Your child should know what a smoke alarm and fire extinguisher are as well. Do you have these safety items in your home? Does your child know where they are located?

Students should know what a sentence is and are beginning to write paragraphs. Try telling fun stories in the car or around the dinner table. Try to include a beginning, middle, and end as you tell these stories.



First grade students continue their subtraction studies as second graders understand three digit numbers and modeling. Please keep practicing basic computation with your child and explore story problems if you have a chance.

This is such a fabulous group of learners. I can't wait to see their growth and learning throughout this new month of October!

Third and Fourth Grade Classroom

Students spent time this week doing a practice SBAC writing project. This will work as our starting point for the school year and will help us to work more directly on the areas they are struggling with in the writing process. Seeing these complex writing prompts early in the year will help students to become more familiar with them so they are not overwhelmed in the spring when it's test time. We will only improve from here!

This week we moved on to the second chapter in math for each grade. 6th Grade is learning about converting fractions to decimals and vice versa. 5th grade is dividing whole numbers through long division and partial quotient division. In Social Studies we have started a new chapter on Ancient Greece to give further background knowledge of the events surrounding Percy Jackson in their ELA book.

Speaking of ELA, we have moved on to the next part of our Percy Jackson unit which looks at literary heroes and the path that they follow. We will be analyzing several heroes from books and movies to see how they fit into this path.
