 - iv. Colony Oak- does that mean that principals do not discipline if it's negative on our dashboard.
 - Mrs. Diederich- well more principals are implementing more proactive actions in order to use more positivity to prevent some of these suspensions.
 - 2. Mrs. Phelps- much of this is really checking in with these students to prevent these things that happen before they occur. We have a whole goal dedicated to the whole student wellness (MTSS). Goal 2 allows us to provide a counselor at each site which seems to be one of the most effective strategies, and they are well received by the majority of the students.

- Mrs. Phelps- our principals are constantly looking at the data to decide how to better the results and close the gaps from the standard. Make sure you are discussing this information at your School Site Council, ELAC, & PFC meetings

3. Additional LCAP Input

- a. Park View representation is concerned about math- we have ELA tutoring but nothing specific for other subjects. Common core curriculum has been the same, but it seems a bit unfair to leave math support responsibility on teachers and what they can do to help.
 - i. Mrs. Phelps- this is our 3rd year where we are contracting with the county (this is why our teachers have been out quite a bit). We have been having intensive training for math. As far as tutoring goes I believe each school site has been provided funding to spend on tutoring. Each site gets to schedule that tutoring as needed, but we have to have a teacher to provide that tutoring. You can always check with the school site principal to see if after school tutoring is provided.

- ii. Park View set up a peer tutoring program with the counselor, but there is not a credentialed teacher in there and that has been helpful but still wanting more support.
- iii. Mrs. Phelps- it will not be next year but we are excited to have a new adoption for Math.
- b. Colony Oak- 6th grade does not have math books to take home, most of it is online. We are struggling over here with math too. The kids are encouraged to go to the library after school, but she is not a math teacher. Who do we ask to create a tutor?
 - We are not sure if there is anyone who is willing to tutor, but maybe check with your principal to see how we can work on this.
 - ii. We are paying the teacher after hours to privately tutor our children.
 - 1. Mrs. Phelps- ask Mrs. Ott if you have funding to pay for a tutor for general education support.

 - a. When teacher's get pulled out for training, it really affects our kids with inconsistency- is there a way to rearrange this so they are in school more often?
 - i. Mrs. Phelps- this year math support is being provided by the county. The county is coming into the classroom to model and provide support. We have been doing Math Lesson Studies and Math coaching. Our teachers have been appreciative of the support and are learning a lot from each other. We only have two teacher work days in which we do not have students present so it does make it a little

challenging to get training and not miss a day of teaching.
