Attendance, It Matters

We are required to take daily attendance and notify you when your student has an unexcused absence. Every absence, excused or unexcused, is a learning opportunity lost and can have significant impacts on a student's success in school and life. A student who misses 18 or more days in a school year—just two days a month—for any reason is considered chronically absent. Chronically absent students are more likely to fall behind in reading and math and less likely to graduate from high school. Addressing chronic absenteeism and developing good attendance habits is a solvable problem for which we all share responsibility. If your student has **three unexcused absences in one month**, state law (RCW 28A.225.020) requires we schedule a conference with you and your student to identify the barriers and supports available to ensure regular attendance. In elementary school after **five excused absences in any month, or ten or more excused absences in the school year**, the school district is required to contact you to schedule a conference at a mutually agreeable, reasonable time with at least one district employee, to identify the barriers and supports available to you and your student. A conference is not required if your student has provided a doctor's note or pre-arranged the absence in writing and the parent, student and school have made a plan so your student does not fall behind academically. If your student has an Individualized Education Program or a 504 Plan the team that created the plan needs to reconvene.



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TTK and Kindergarten

Welcome back! I hope everyone enjoyed a restful break. It has been wonderful to see all of our students again.

In Kindergarten, students are reviewing letter sounds learned prior to the break. They are practicing reading and spelling four- and five-letter words, as well as writing complete sentences. Our focus in writing includes beginning sentences with a capital letter, using finger spaces between words, and ending sentences with appropriate punctuation.

In Math, Kindergarten students are working on addition and subtraction by finding missing numbers in number sentences (e.g., $8 + ? = 10$). They are using manipulatives and number bonds to support their understanding.

TTK has continued their unit on plants. Students are learning about the parts of a plant and what plants need to survive. They are also learning the letter sounds and proper formation of the letters M and A.
