Nurse Notes

Medication At School

As per Arizona School Boards Association Policy #J-5361 & JLCD-R, ANY medication MUST come through the Nurse's Office and from the parent not the student. Medication Must be unopened and in the original container.

- I will not be giving any over the counter medication after 2:00pm, due to over medicating students.

Sick Day Guidelines (When to keep your student home)

School policy requests a child stay home if he or she:

- Has a fever of 100.4 degrees or higher. Keep your child home until his or her fever has been gone for 24 hours without medication.
- Has been vomiting or has been diarrhea. Keep your child home 12-24 hours after the last vomiting or diarrhea episode.
- Has symptoms that keep him or her from participating in school, such as:
 - Very tired or lack of appetite
 - Cough that he or she cannot control
 - Moderate to severe headache, body aches or earache
 - Sore throat-a minor sore throat is ok for school, but a severe sore throat could be strep throat, even if there is no fever.

Injuries

Students with obvious injuries, such as splints, casts, crutches, etc., need to present a note from the parent or doctor to the health office that specifies:

- The nature of the injury
- What accommodations will be needed
- When accommodations will no longer be needed

Your student will not be allowed to participate in activities such as PE and recess until he has been cleared by the doctor or a parent.

Injuries that happen at home, sports activities, or over the weekend need to be addressed at that time. The Health Office is not a doctor's office.

On a happy note, thank you parents for getting your child's immunizations completed and turned in. A way to be proactive is to check with your pediatrician to see if shots are due.

COVID-19 is still very much alive in our community. PLEASE monitor your child with At-Home Daily Health Screenings BEFORE sending him/her to school. Please follow the following protocol established by CDC Guidelines:

Students MUST NOT come to school if they exhibit ANY of the following symptoms:

- Fever of 100.4 degrees or higher, or chills
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Cough
- Fatigue
- Headache
- Muscle or body aches
- Sore throat
- Congestion/runny nose
- Nausea/vomiting
- Diarrhea
- New loss of taste or smell



*This list may not include all possible symptoms. A student with a daily runny nose or congestion due to allergies should not be kept at home.
