Make-up Policy:

Assigned tests or other class assignments that a student misses due to an absence must be made up within 3 school days after the student returns to school. If for any reason this work cannot be made up during this period of time, permission for an extension must be granted by the teacher. Any assignments or test not completed in class will receive a zero.
