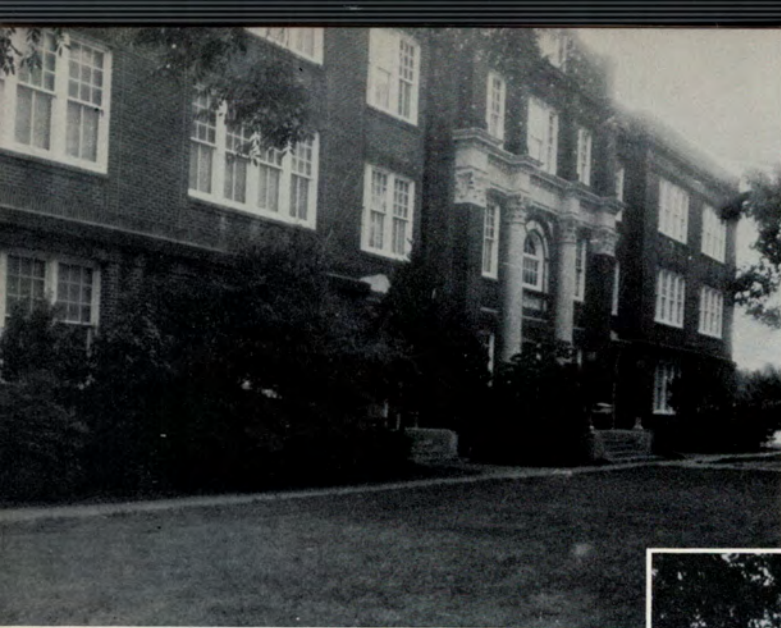

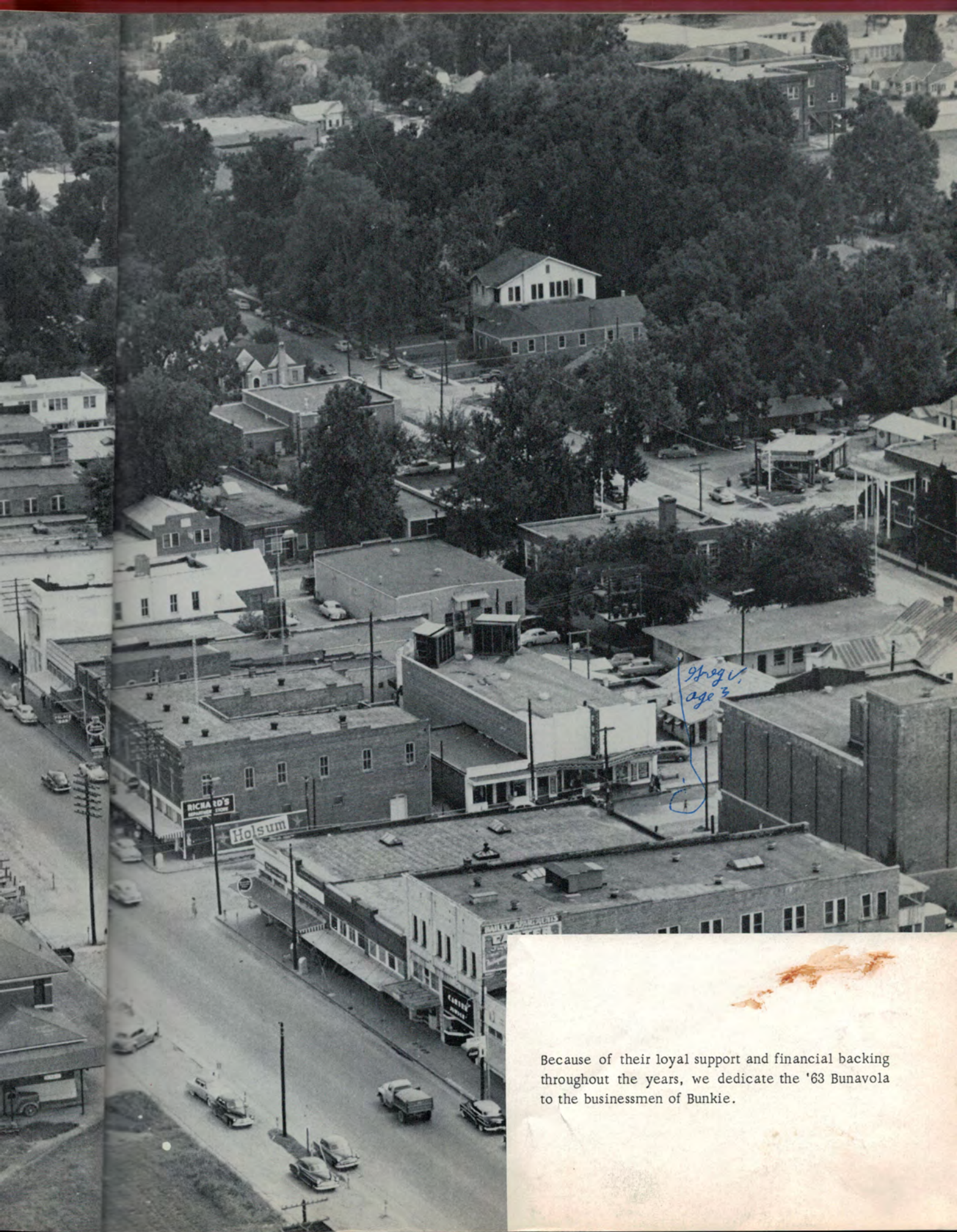

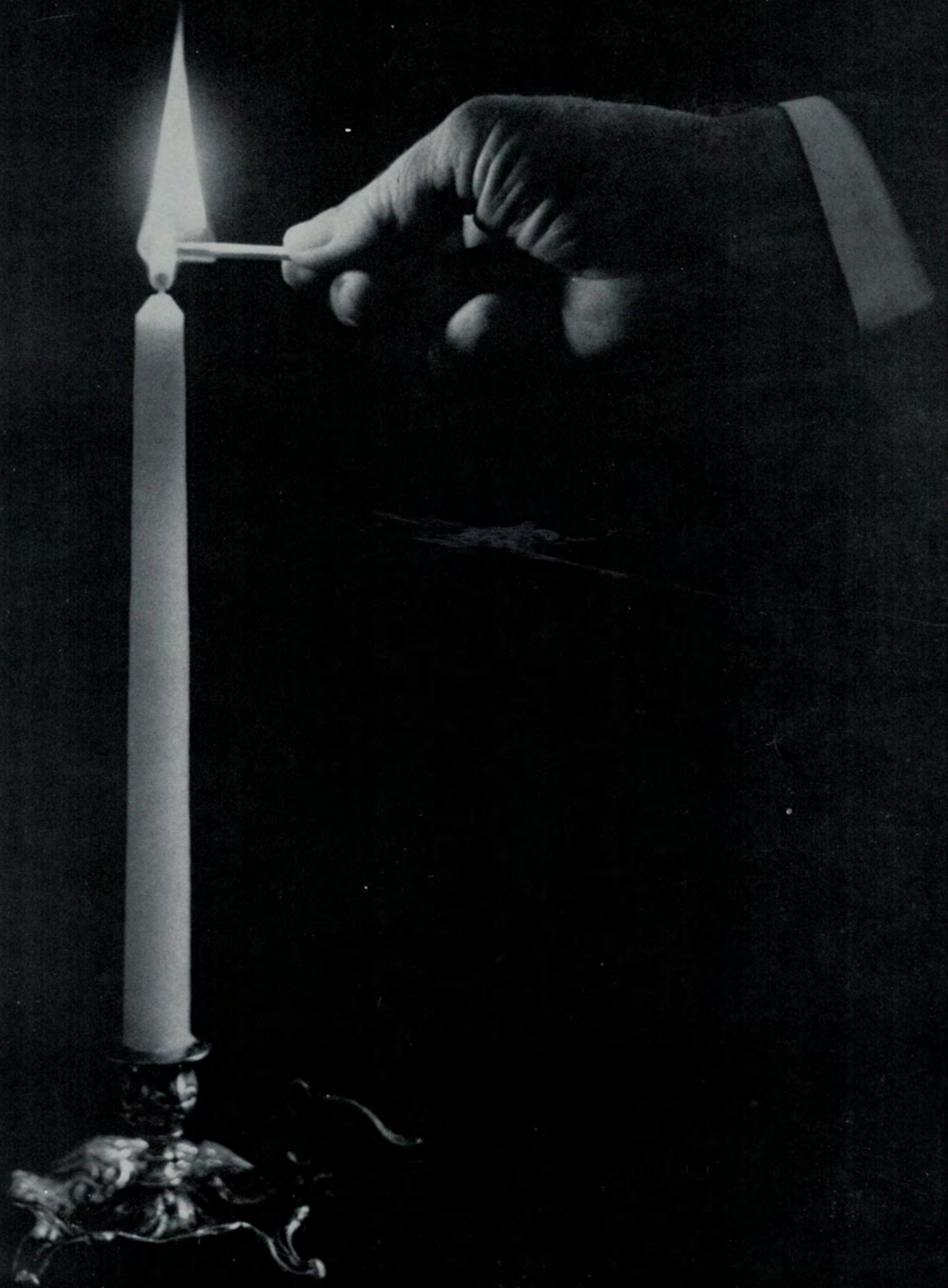

To the seniors, we wish for you the best in health, happiness, and prosperity.

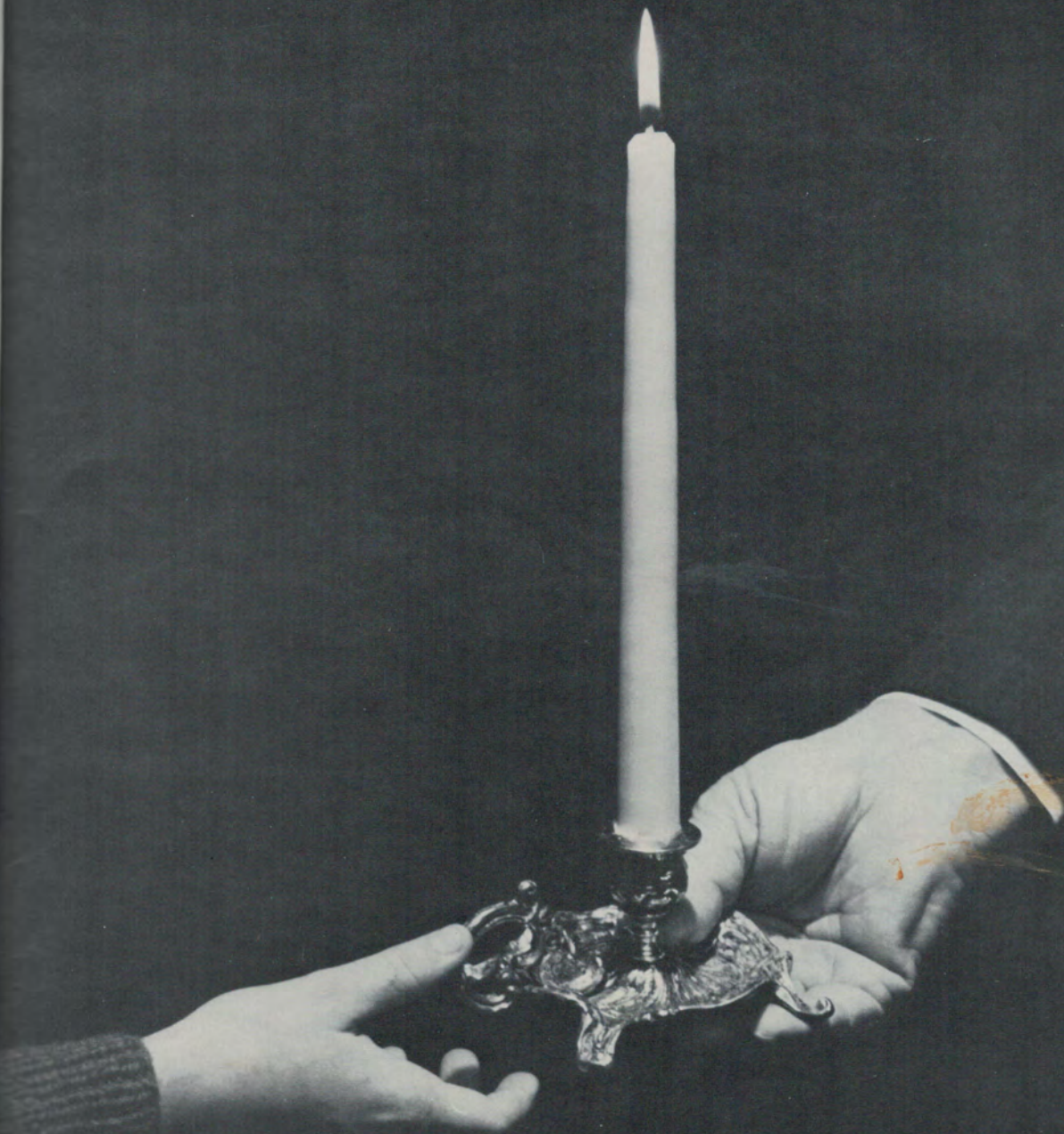

### The Colonial Period

Our English Heritage. The French, Spanish, Dutch, Norwegian, and other Europeans settled in parts of what was to become the United States. But it was the English who came in the largest numbers.
