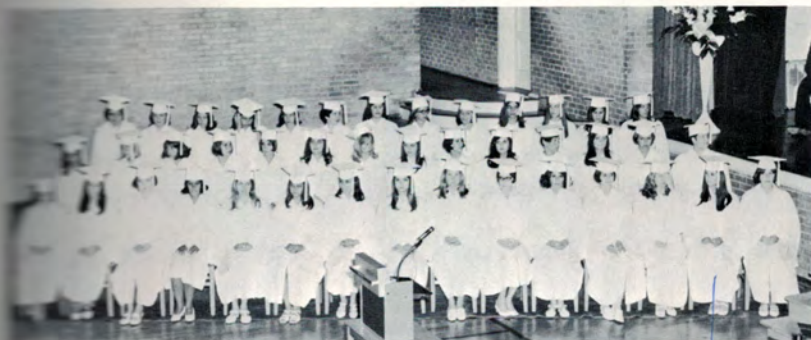
Valerie Voelker was crowned by Mr. Cal-cote and Miss Bunkie Ginny Wright presented her with roses.

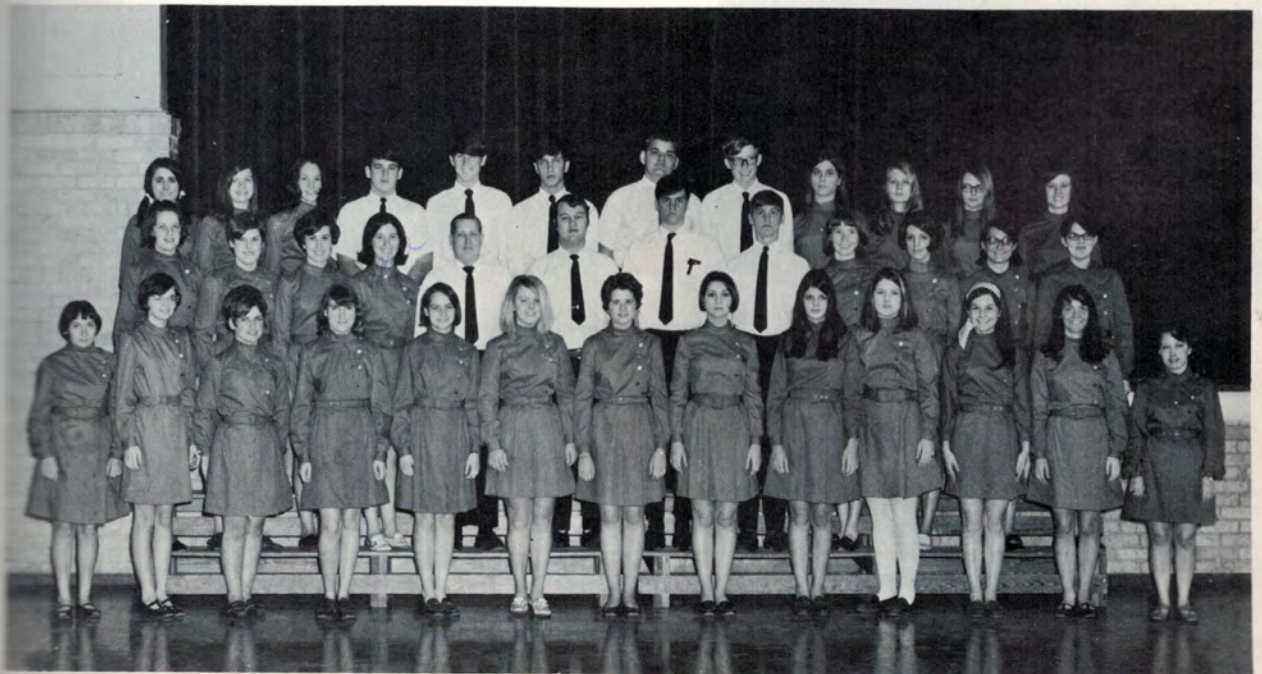

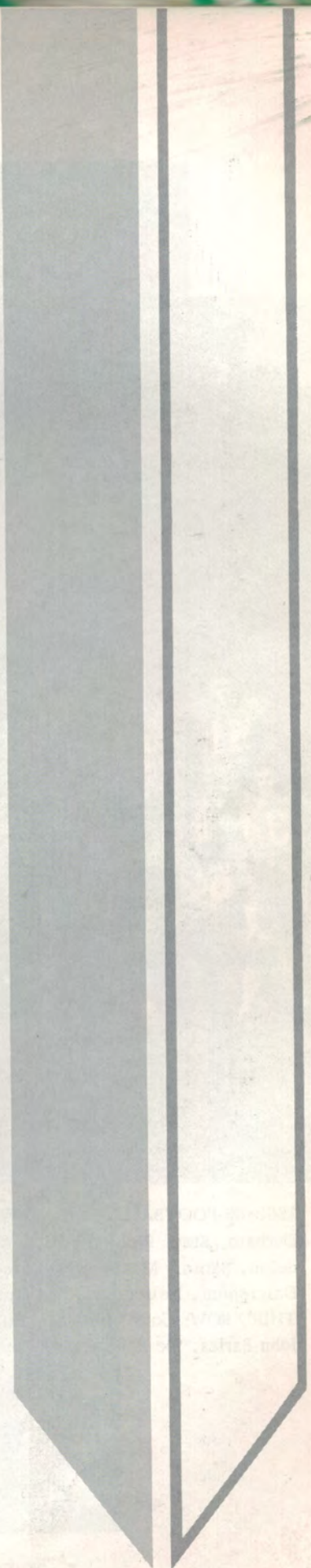
Track And Basketball Teams Honored At Annual Banquet

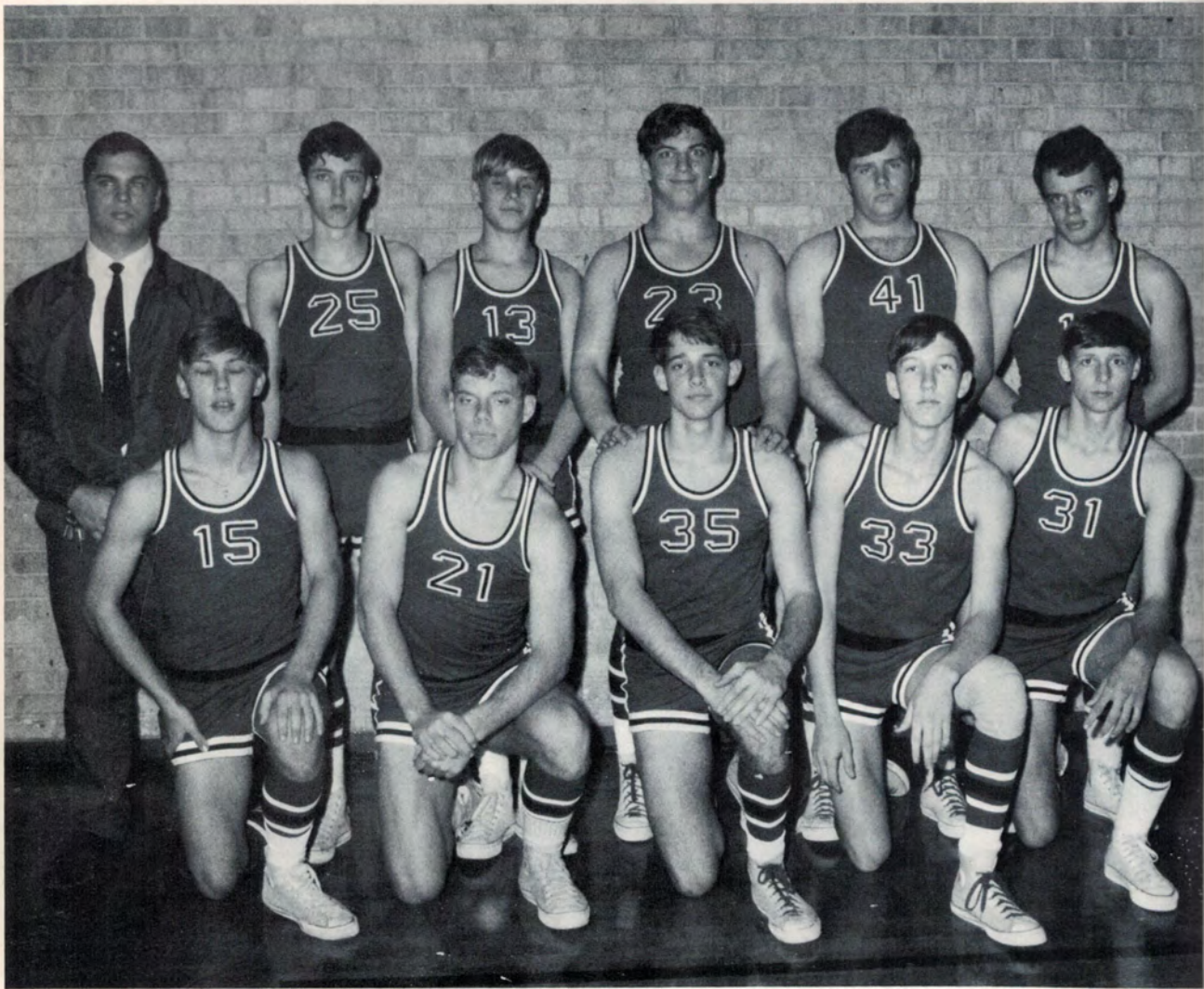

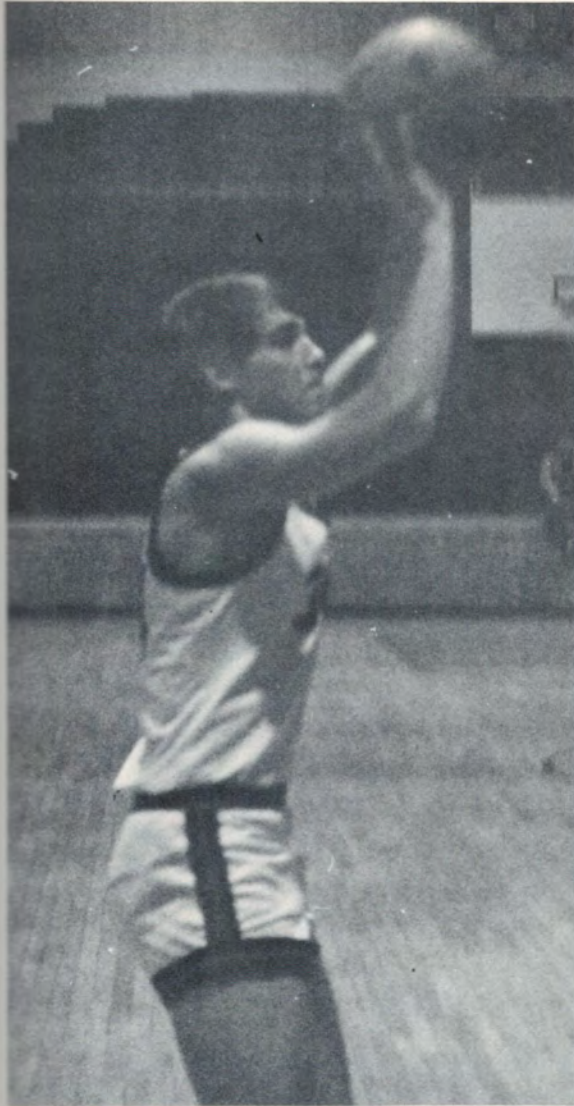
