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

The PCCHS Commodore Players Present: Alice's Adventures in Wonderland





<u>Air Rifle Team</u>

Q: How many shooters are there?

A: 10 or 12 showed up on the first meet but more could join if they wanted to.

Q: What time do they practice air rifle?

A: Monday through Thursday - they practice from 5 to 6:30 but on Fridays, they practice 4 to 5:30.

Q: What do you shoot?

A: You use a 22 caliber pellet gun. You shoot a paper target and behind there is a pellet catcher.

Q: Are there tryouts?

A: There are no tryouts right now. If you show up to practice, you can shoot. There are just a few requirements you and the coaches have to figure out first.

Q: When did the sport start?

A: They started 6 weeks ago, and it ends at the beginning of May.

Q: Are there any fundraisers going on?

A: Last year they sold T-shirts to raise money, and this year they are thinking about doing the same thing. The parents will have to help with the fundraiser if many students join the team. Last year they also sold blankets, took donations, and other things, so they could afford prizes at tournaments for other shooters.

Q: Any permission slip?

A: There is no permission slip needed as of now , but there is a for a parent meeting. Q: Where do the practices take place?

A: They practice at a former wood and smith center, by the Fire Safety and Ride Safety on Highway 15.

Q: Any competitions?

A: There are no competitions right now. At the moment, they are trying to get KSHAA approval for the team and/or competing against other teams. Our team right now is competing against each other.

Q: Can anyone join?

A: Anyone interested can join the team and show up to practice. If your parents need to talk to the coach, just let them know where and when the practice is and show up with your parents.
