#### **EARLY RELEASE THURSDAYS**

Beginning August 3rd through the end of May, students will be dismissed at 1pm EVERY Thursday. Students will attend their regular classes and have lunch, although the class periods will be shorter.

#### SYNERGY PARENT VUE

Keep track of your students grades by logging into your Synergy ParentVue account. You will need an activation key in order to log in for the first time. If you have not already created an account, instructions and an activation key will be provided on request.

Students also have access to a StudentVue account as an opportunity to keep track of their grades.

## PICTURE DAY SEPTEMBER 22nd

Picture Day is Friday, September 22nd. Picture packets will be sent home with students the week prior. All students are required to have their photo taken for student IDs and to be included in the yearbook. If the student is not in attendance this day, picture retakes will be done on November 3rd.

#### **LUNCH APPLICATIONS**

The school year 2023-24 Free and Reduced Meals application must be renewed each year. Parents please renew your applications on line at lhusd.org/freereducedmeals. Hard copies will be available during registration if you are unable to complete this process at home.

All students that were approved for school year 2022-23 in the LHUSD will have their benefits carryover until September 1, 2023. We encourage you to get your new application resubmitted as early as possible to avoid any lapse in benefit.

Milk, bottled water, or ala carte items will be available for students to purchase during lunch.

\*There has been an increase in meal prices due to USDA Regulations. Breakfast is \$1.60, Lunch is \$3.10.

We ask that you complete an application whether or not you intend to use it.

\*It is important to note that a new application must be filled out each year.

#### **LUNCH ACCOUNTS**

Meal accounts can be set up online at LinQconnect.com. You can log in online or download the app to your phone. Meal accounts can be funded, you can check balances and also set up to receive low balance alerts for your student. There is a \$2.60 service fee per transaction.

- Taher will accept personal checks made out to LHUSD
- Taher has a "NO CHANGE" policy for meals. Any money given to a cashier for any purchase that has change coming, will be put on the student's account. No change will be given back.
- If students do not have a lunch or money on their account, they will be given an alternate meal on request consisting of peanut butter, crackers, carrot sticks, ranch dressing, a fruit and milk.



#### **SCHOOL FEES**

- Band class in which students must rent instruments have an additional fee attached (\$5-\$40/semester).
- Students in P.E. will be required to purchase the mandatory P.E. shorts.
- Standardized wear is required to purchase.

#### NO CHECK POLICY

We will gladly accept cash, debit/credit cards, or money orders (NO Checks) for purchases made in the Thunderbolt office.

Please DO NOT send \$50 or \$100 bills with your child to school for lunch or other school purchases.

Parents/guardians can call to report an absence at anytime and leave a voicemail message - on the attendance phone number. If you do not call in your student's absence, you will receive an automated message from us.

## ATTENDANCE MATTERS EXCESSIVE ABSENCES OR TARDIES

It is critical for students to be in school to learn and just as important that they are in class when the bell rings. Every minute counts for the highest level of learning! We will recognize those classes periodically who have the lowest number of absences and/or tardies.

## If a student is tardy more than four (4) times per quarter he/she will earn a consequence.

This includes *both excused* and *unexcused* tardies. Absences are considered excessive if they exceed eight (8) per semester. This includes both excused and unexcused absences. If you have a note from a doctor please send it with your child.

Please note that attendance and tardies may affect citizenship grades, sports and club eligibility. Missing critical instruction often affects academic grades. The Lake Havasu Police Department does enforce the compulsory attendance law.

#### STUDENT HANDBOOK

#### TITLE 1/PARENTS' RIGHT TO KNOW

We are a Title I School. Title I provides financial assistance to local educational agencies to meet the needs of special educationally disadvantaged children. The purpose of Title I is to help all children achieve the state's academic standards. This is accomplished through supplemental programs that consist of instructional services, instructional support services, school wide reform efforts, and increased involvement of parents in their children's education.

We are pleased to notify you that in accordance with the Elementary and Secondary Act (ESEA), as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), you have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's teacher. Specifically, you may request the following:

- Whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or substitute status.
- The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

#### NO BACKPACKS IN THE CLASSROOM

For the safety of our students, please keep in mind that backpacks are not allowed in the classrooms. They must be kept in the student lockers at all times during the school day. The backpacks with wheels do not fit in the lockers, so please avoid purchasing that style.

#### WATER BOTTLES / DRINKING CONTAINERS

If your student chooses to bring water to school, please follow these guidelines:

- Re-useable water bottles/containers must contain WATER ONLY.
- No energy drinks, coffee, Vitamin water, Gatorade, sodas or any other liquids that contain alcohol or high levels of caffeine will be allowed in the building. All drinks must conform to the District Wellness Policy and Arizona Nutrition Standards. (J-4950)
- Drink refreshments brought into the building by students may be used for breakfast or lunch purposes. They are not to be taken into classrooms.
- Food and drinks purchased in the cafeteria must be consumed and disposed of prior to leaving the cafeteria.

#### **DRESS CODE**

- All students are required to wear the District Board approved Thunderbolt standardized shirts at all times during the regular school day.
- Students are required to wear the District Board approved LHUSD standardized outerwear at all times during the regular school day. No other jackets can be worn inside the building.
- Standardized shirts and/or standardized jackets cannot be altered, tied, or cut.
- Bottoms must be fingertip length, or longer, and cover all undergarments.
   Please keep this in mind when shopping for school clothes.

When a student's attire violates the dress code, the office will supply the student with school appropriate clothing items to wear during that school day.

#### **DISTRICT WELLNESS POLICY**

Due to Arizona Nutrition Standards and our District Wellness Policy, parents must make arrangements with their student's teacher to bring store bought treats for the entire classroom. Parents may bring lunch or arrange a food delivery for their child only. Please do not bring food for your child's friends.

\*Please do not bring or drop off homemade treats or food items.

#### **BUS INFORMATION**

The LHUSD school board policy for transportation of students establishes the distance of one (1) mile from home to school for middle school students eligible for bus service.

- Registering for bus service needs to be done each year.
- If you move or your student is off the bus for more than 5 days you will need to re-register in the school office.
- Students cannot be transported to another bus stop other than the one assigned to them.
- Sharing a ride with a friend is not permitted.

<u>Students/Parents will be able to find out their bus</u> <u>stop locations and times during registration days.</u>

#### **CELL PHONE PROCEDURES**

Students must leave cell phone in their locked locker or leave cell phone at home. Guidelines for Students:

- A. The student takes full responsibility for their device.
- B. The student adheres to the rules stated in the IT Use Agreement policy.

Students in possession of their phone/device during class will earn a consequence and may require the parent to pick up the device.

#### SPORTS PHYSICALS

If your student will be participating in sports this year, it is mandatory they have a physical on file. Physicals are good 1 year from the date of the

#### **TAX CREDIT**

Taxpayers filing in Arizona have the unique opportunity to redirect a portion of state tax dollars they already pay, to public education. The credit allows an Arizona taxpayer to contribute \$200 per individual tax return or \$400 per joint tax return to a school's extra curricular program.

#### Who can make a contribution?

We can accept contributions only from individuals; not businesses or corporations.

Do I have to have children enrolled in school? No. Any Arizona individual paying state income tax can make a tax credit contribution to be used towards extra curricular fees.

Do I have to live within the District? No. Any individual who pays Arizona State income tax can contribute.

Do I have to donate the full \$200 or \$400? No, but remember, you can take this credit on any tax liability for state income taxes up to \$200 on an individual tax return or \$400 on a joint return. You may donate up to your \$200 or \$400 limit in installments during the calendar year or donate it at one time.

How does this work on my tax return?

As an example, lets say you made a \$300 tax credit contribution. When you file your state taxes, you will note the credit with a 322 form (downloadable from the State). If your State tax return calculates to a \$500 refund, applying the credit will increase your refund to \$800. If your State tax return calculates to a \$400 liability (you owe) then applying the credit will reduce your liability to \$100. However, you cannot receive a refund greater than your State income tax assessment for the tax year.

Tax Credit contributions are to the school/activity of your choice or can be made for individual students!

- A student or parent may ask a relative or another individual to make a tax credit contribution in the student's name in
  any amount up to \$400 (for couples filing jointly) and specify on the tax credit form that the money is to be applied to the
  athlete's fee.

#### PARKING LOT PROCEDURES

Parents,

We have worked hard over the last few years to create a parking lot procedure that keeps the traffic flow moving and keeps students safe. Although it's a bit challenging to get such a large number of parents in and out in a short amount of time, our system works well with everyone's cooperation.

Please follow these procedures:

#### **MORNING & AFTERNOON DROP OFF & PICK UP PROCEDURE**

#### See map on the following page with instructions

#### ALL STUDENTS MEETING PARKED CARS MUST CROSS WITH THE CROSSING GUARD FOR SAFETY.

Please do NOT form a second lane of traffic in between the cars at the fence and the parking lot.

- This is unsafe for picking up your child and others.
- Cars are not watching for students to cut in between cars.
- A second lane also blocks the traffic waiting to come into and out of the drop off lane.

When leaving a parking space cars must loop around to join the traffic flow running parallel to the fence. We will be in the lot to guide you in the process.

There are slight differences between the morning and afternoon procedures. This is because cars in the afternoon may need to circle the parking lot to locate a parking spot. They must have the ability to do so. This is not the case in the morning as all cars are moving quickly through the lot after dropping off students.

We would ask that you remain 100% focused on the traffic and students while in the lot by not talking on your cell phone during pick up and drop off. Student safety is our goal.



If the drop-off lane is full, turn to the left and pull forward to the teacher at the cross walk.




