Even though this is a short week, it will be a rich week! One of the first things we're going over is punctuation. Are question marks really that important!?. The last two days we've celebrated Presidents' Day in honor of all of the people that have served as president of the United States. 
- Light, staccato notes → Quick, playful, or sneaky movements (like tiptoeing or a comedic chase).
- Slow, sustained chords → Dramatic, heavy, or sorrowful movement (like someone in deep thought or grief).
- Chaotic, dissonant sounds → Confusion, fear, or conflict (like running from danger or an argument).
- Grand, sweeping melodies → Majestic or triumphant movement (like a hero's entrance).
- This game is a great way to develop students' instincts for musical storytelling.
