

### TTK and Kindergarten

Kindergarten students have begun learning letter sounds as part of their early literacy development. For each letter introduced, students practice writing the letter, learn the corresponding ASL hand sign, and engage in a fun letter chant to reinforce the sound. This week, we are focusing on the letters m, a, t, and d.

In math, students are exploring the concepts of greater than, less than, and equal to, using numbers 1 through 5. Next, they will begin learning to count and write numbers 6 through 9, as well as identifying number pairs that add up to each number.

TK students are developing critical thinking skills by identifying objects that belong together. They began by matching items that are exactly the same, then moved on to those that are similar, and are now working on items that go together—such as a crayon and paper. In math, TK students are also working with numbers 1 through 5, building a strong numerical foundation.

During daily circle time, all students participate in calendar activities. They are learning the months of the year, days of the week, and are practicing counting the days. This month, we've also introduced the concept of patterns, which students are beginning to explore through songs, visuals, and interactive activities.

Students made compass roses this week. They should know their cardinal and intermediate directions.

They are comparing the value of numbers in math. They also wrote great pieces about a squirrel who found an acorn that was too big.



## Third and Fourth Grade Classroom

This year our class is making a paper chain to show our reading. Everytime a student passes an AR test they get to add a link to the chain. The color of the chain corresponds with the point value of the book. I am super impressed with the students' reading. The chain has gone down one side of our classroom and is now headed across the back of the room!

As a class we continue to practice our basic multiplication facts daily. The memorization of these facts is essential to a student's future success in math. We practice these skills through a variety of methods including daily timed tests, and games. A huge shout out to Scarlett for being the first student to complete all levels A-Z with 2 minute timing! She will now start back at level A and try to complete all the levels with only 1 minute. Practicing facts with your child for even a minute or two a night can have a huge impact!

## Fifth and Sixth Grade Classroom

It's been a busy and exciting week! We began reading *Bud*, *Not Buddy* and had some great discussions about the story's themes and characters. In science, students explored what makes planets habitable and compared conditions across our solar system. Fifth graders have been mastering decimals, while sixth graders took it a step further with decimal division. In social studies, everyone wrapped up their state slide projects—great work showcasing creativity and research skills!
