Tablets- PVHS distributes a tablet and charger to every student so they can complete schoolwork. Students are required to bring their fully charged tablet to school every day. There are no exceptions, so don't let your student leave home without it.

Canvas and Aeries- PVHS uses Canvas as our Learning Management System and

Aeries as our student information system. Access buttons and resource information can be found on our website at www.pvhspanthers.org. These programs allow both parents and students to view classes, see grades on completed assignments, and list missing assignments. We encourage all parents to explore the features and resources on our website so you can monitor the progress of your student.

Our talented staff has high expectations for all students and our counselors will be offering various nighttime meetings to educate families about state and federal expectations, career pathways, and the A-G college ready requirements. Students who are not meeting academic and behavioral expectations will be required to have a mandatory parent conference and academic plan.

Link Crew orientation is Friday, August 5th from 8:00-1:00 for ninth graders in our gym. This amazing mentorship program

connects freshmen with upperclassmen and students will do fun activities, access their

schedules, and learn to navigate school information from their phones. This positive event is for students only, so no parent attendance please.

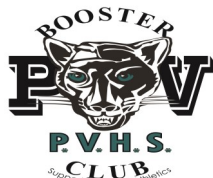
Parents on a Mission

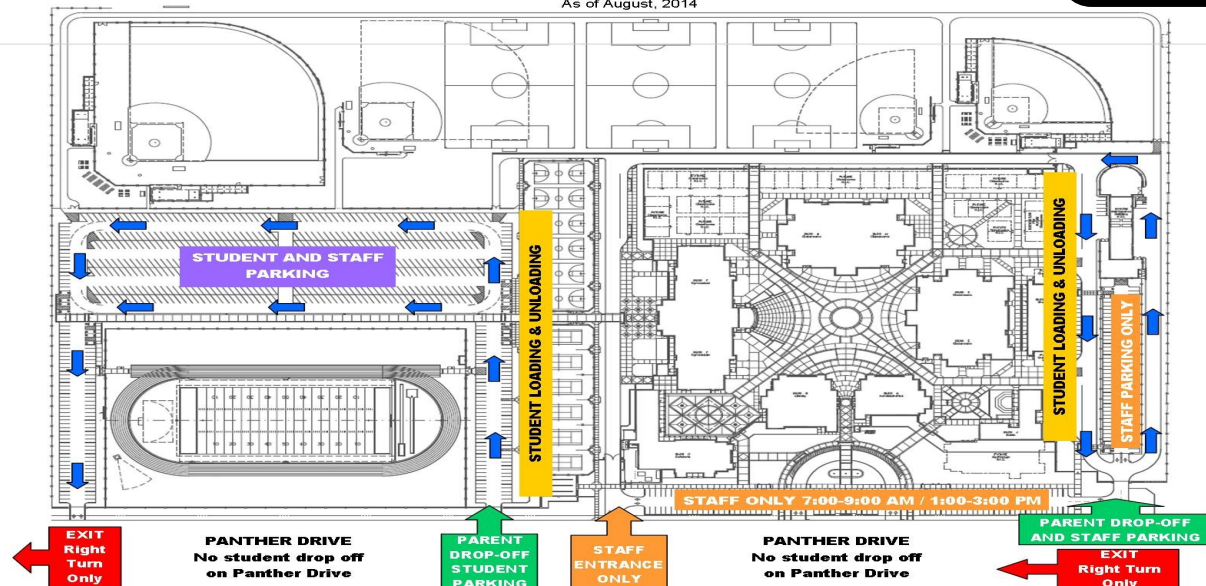

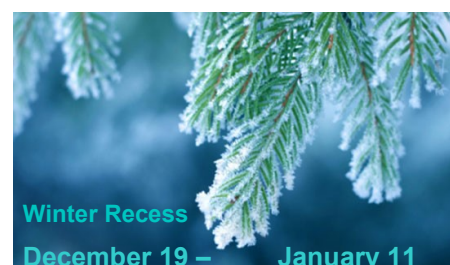

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

CHANGE OF ADDRESS

If your address, phone numbers, emergency or personal information has changed since last school year, please update your information in the school Records Office. It is very important that we have current contact information in order for us to successfully send out school messages and alert you in case of an emergency.

CLASSROOM INTERRUPTIONS

Messages from parents or guardians during classtime will be limited to emergencies only with administrator approval. We are committed to preserving the integrity of instruction and do not interrupt classes to call students out for personal deliveries. Items left for pickup are done so at own risk. Parents are welcome to come during passing periods to have their student paged.

CLOSED CAMPUS / VISITOR POLICY

PVHS is a closed campus between 7 am and 4 pm. As per Board Policy (AR 6116 and BP1250), only pre-arranged visitors are allowed on campus during the school day. Lunchtime activities/assemblies are for current students. Parents and other visitors are not allowed at these closed events. Students are not permitted to bring visitors. Administration reserves the right to refuse admission to anyone.

DRESS CODE

Requirements apply to all students, as provided in the Education Code and/or District Policy. They are:

1. No attire including clothing, jewelry, hats or personal items:
 - may promote or advertise drugs, alcohol or tobacco use.
 - depict obscenity or lewdness.
 - be inflammatory with regard to race, religion or heritage.
 - may promote gang affiliation (nor pro sports teams)
2. Feet must be covered, minimally, providing protection to the bottom of the foot. (PE requires tennis shoes for safe participation in activities.)
3. The upper torso must be covered. Clothes shall be sufficient to conceal undergarments at all times. See-through or fishnet fabrics, halter tops, spaghetti straps (must be two inches wide), off-the-shoulder or low-cut tops, bare midriffs and skirts or shorts shorter than mid-thigh are prohibited.
4. Pajamas and slippers are not appropriate school apparel.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Cell phones may be carried by students, but will be confiscated if they disrupt the educational process. If a phone is confiscated from the student, a parent / guardian will be required to pick it up from the Assistant Principal. **The school is not financially responsible for any lost or stolen items.**

ELIGIBILITY FOR EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Students must maintain a 2.0 "C" grade point average to be eligible to participate in extra-curricular activities. Eligibility is determined at the end of each six-week grading period.

EXCUSING ABSENCES

Parents will be allowed to report and clear absences within two (2) school days of the absences one of several ways:

- By phone
- By written note
- Walk-ins
- By email
- Via the website link

When notifying the school of your student's absence, please include the following information:

- Student's first and last name
- Grade
- ID number
- Date and reason for absence
- Parent/Guardian name
- Relationship to the student
- Phone number where you can be reached

PLEASE NOTE: Per District policy, upon 14 or more days of excused absences, we request that any future absences be verified by a physician in the form of a note.

ID CARDS

Students are to carry their ID cards at all times. ID cards are used to verify that a student belongs on campus, to check out textbooks, library materials, tablets or PE loaners. The first card is free; each card after is \$3 paid at the Business Office.

LEAVING CAMPUS DURING THE DAY

Parents / guardians who need to take their student out of school during the day **must be prepared to show identification at the Attendance Office.** Only those persons listed on the student's medical emergency information will be allowed to take the student from school. The school appreciates every effort made by parents to schedule appointments outside of the school day.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

To be considered in **good standing** and determine your privilege in participating in extra-curricular activities including sporting events, club performances, dances, Grad Night and graduation ceremonies, students should have:

- No major discipline issues
- No outstanding ASB, library, textbook or tablet charges - "IF YOU OWE, YOU DON'T GO."
- No more than 6 period cuts for every three weeks that school is in session - "NO SHOW...NO GO."
- Must be on track to graduate.

TOBACCO-FREE SCHOOL

The use of all tobacco products including e-cigarettes and vaping devices is prohibited on campus and at school events.

WITHDRAWAL FROM CLASSES

Students who drop a course during the first 20 school days of the semester, may do so without any entry on his/her permanent record. A student who drops a course after 20 school days of enrollment in a class shall receive an "F" on their permanent record unless otherwise decided by the principal or designee because of extenuating circumstances.

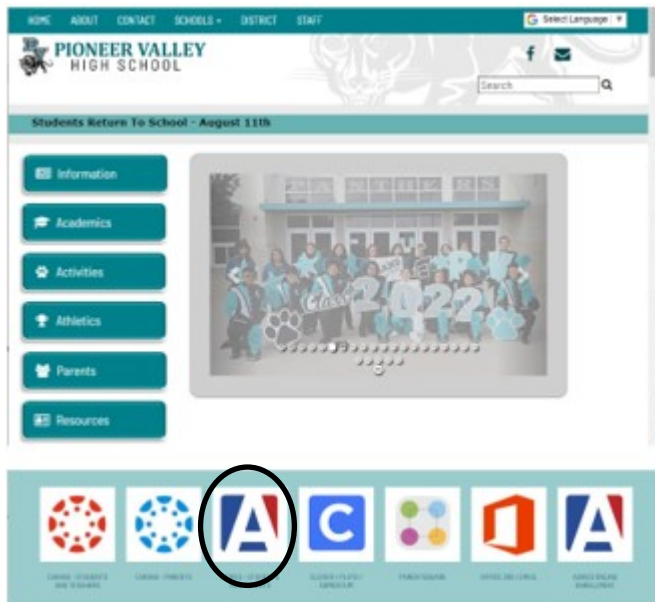

LOGGING IN TO THE PARENT STUDENT PORTAL

- Select your preferred language—English, Spanish, Vietnamese, Chinese, Korean or Arabic.
- When a student enrolls at PVHS, a system-generated email is sent to the email address provided at the time of enrollment. The email contains a verification code. Parents must sign in using this email
- By entering this verification code and corresponding student information - student ID number and home telephone—access to the portal will be given.
- If a home email changes, parents must notify the school of the change.
- Use the "Forgot Password" feature if needed.

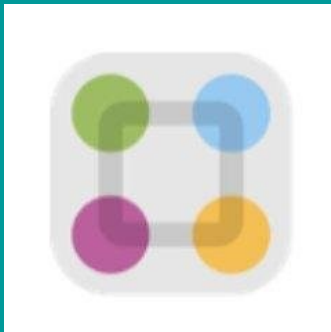
