Lord, it is good to give thanks to you.

Dear Parishioners.

We are pleased to have Bishop Zielinski with us this Sunday as he imparts the sacrament of Confirmation on our parishioners this weekend (and the 3 confirmed last weekend). Congratulations to the newly confirmed members of our Area Faith Community.

This Wednesday begins our Lent Fast. The Church requires fasting on Ash Wednesday (March 5) and Good Friday (April 18) for those 18 - 59 years of age and abstaining from meat for those who are 14 or older on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of

Lent including Good Friday.

Fasting is defined as one normal meal with 2 smaller meals. Abstinence is not eating meat of animals and birds (though in some places there are special rules like eating of muskrat – a penance in itself if you ask me). The flesh of fish, shellfish, reptiles and amphibians is allowed (again, eating reptiles and amphibians might be penance in itself). Technically, broths and animal fats are not forbidden, but should be avoided if we are able. Dairy products (milk, cheese, or eggs) are allowed. As you can see, the Church is pretty lenient in how we fast and abstain. It should be noted that technically, the Church requires abstaining from meat every Friday of the year (except when there is a solemnity).

In addition to fasting and abstaining, we should try to eliminate vice in our lives and the building of virtue. With that, I recommend selecting a virtue that you are most in need of or desire, and for the season of Lent, pray that the Lord would increase that virtue in you. You might consider reading a devotional or reading the Daily Mass readings, even if you are unable to attend the Mass. The Church has selected the Readings to give us a working retreat of sorts, to reflect on the nature of sin, the call to grace, and to prepare us for the celebration of the Lord's resurrection, so it would be wise to read the Readings and reflect on them.

Monday of this last week, I had an appointment with my gastroenterologist. In piecing things together, we are relatively sure of a plan should I experience the stomach issues that I did at the beginning of the year. Luckily, he can order some tests to be run in Marshall that will pinpoint the root cause and perhaps point to a possible aid. I am hopeful for this.

We also have a plan in place for some emergency medication if I experience issues while traveling should the pilgrimage to the Holy Land be held. While I hope not to have an episode, I am hopeful that if I do, we will find the cause.


