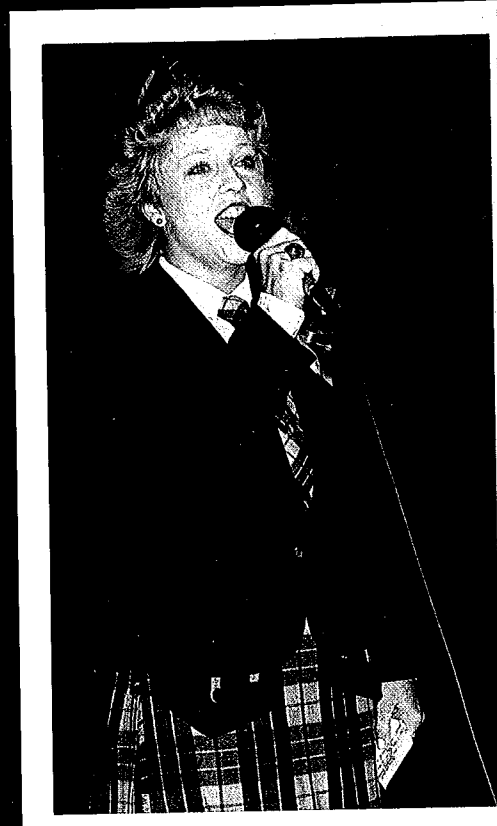
# ... Beat the Opposition Lake Wales 20, Ft. Meade 0

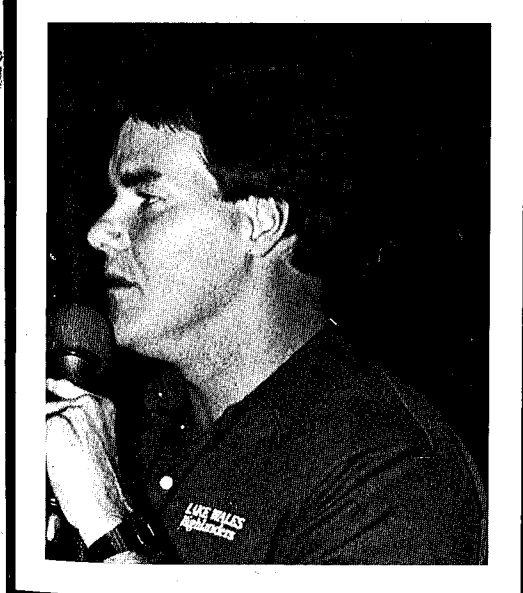

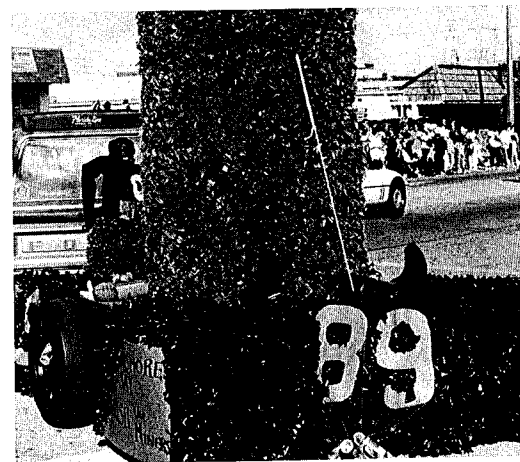


# Sophomore Spirit Shines

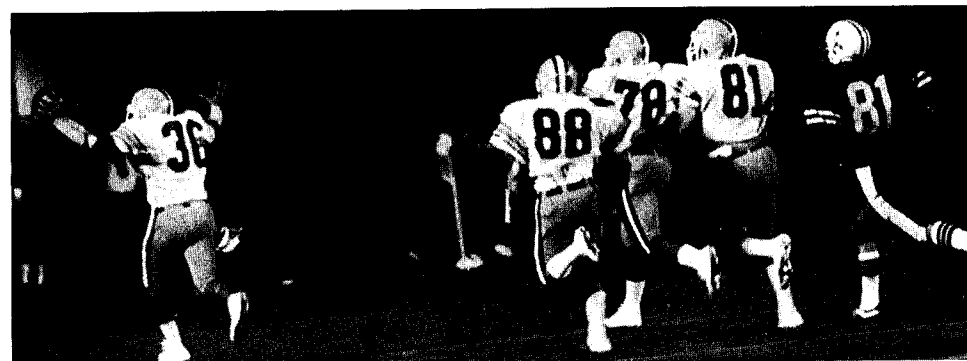
# Highlanders Shut 'Em Out

# Wrestlers Crush Bartow

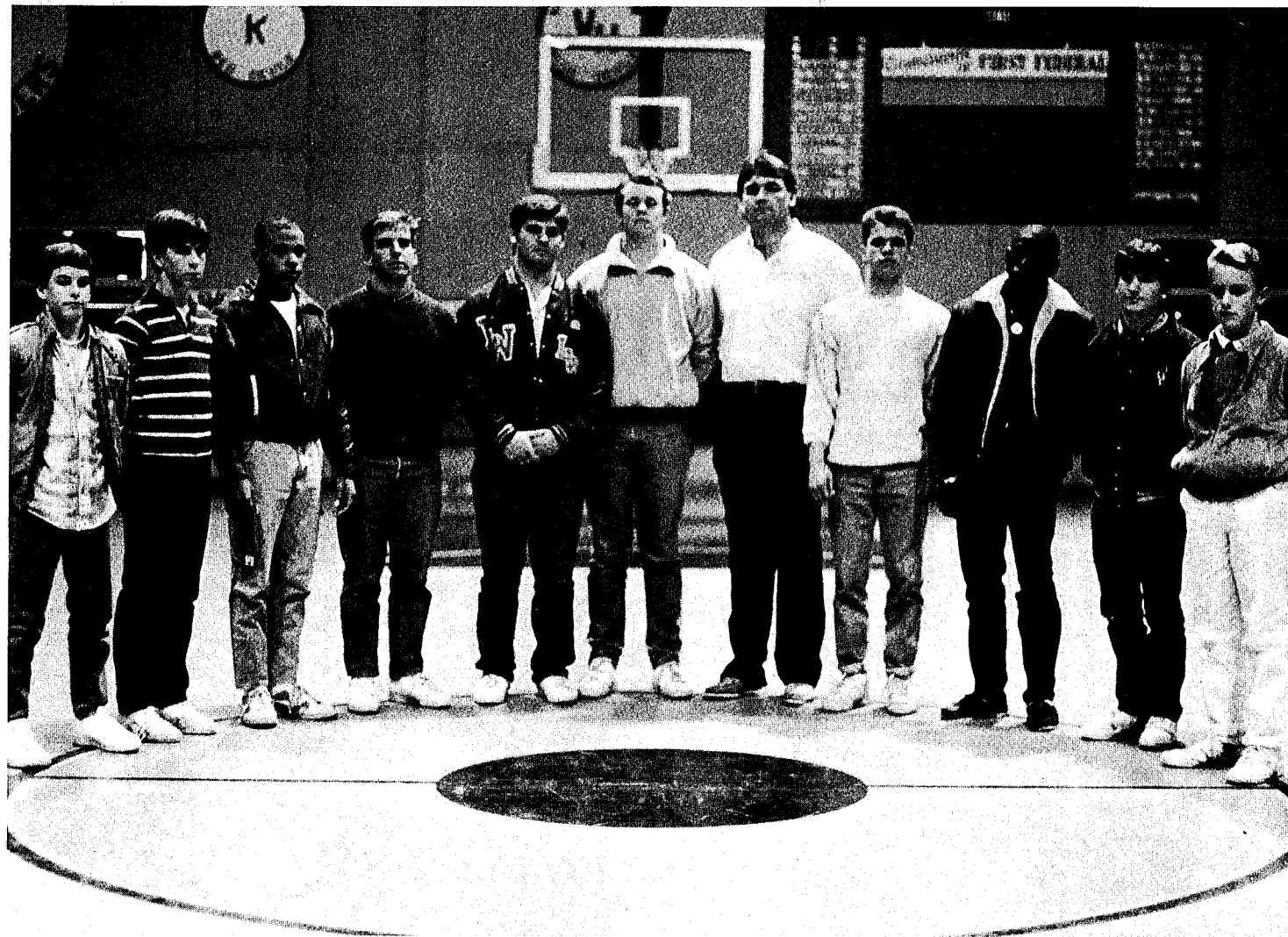
Although the Highlander Wrestlers were 3-6 on the season, two of those victories were crushing wins over archrival Bartow. They also beat Kathleen.

## Relay Team Best in State

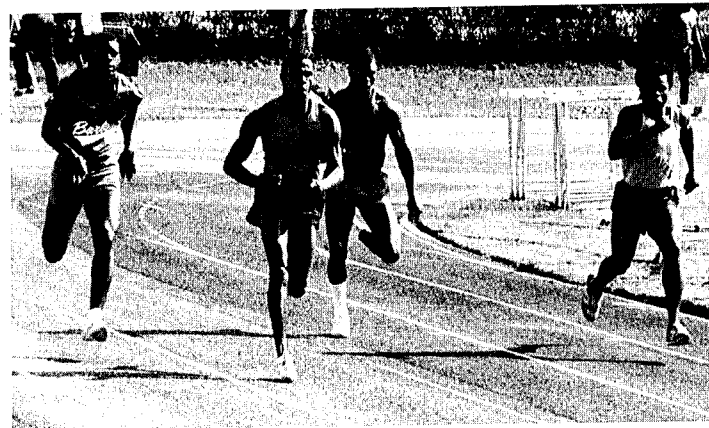

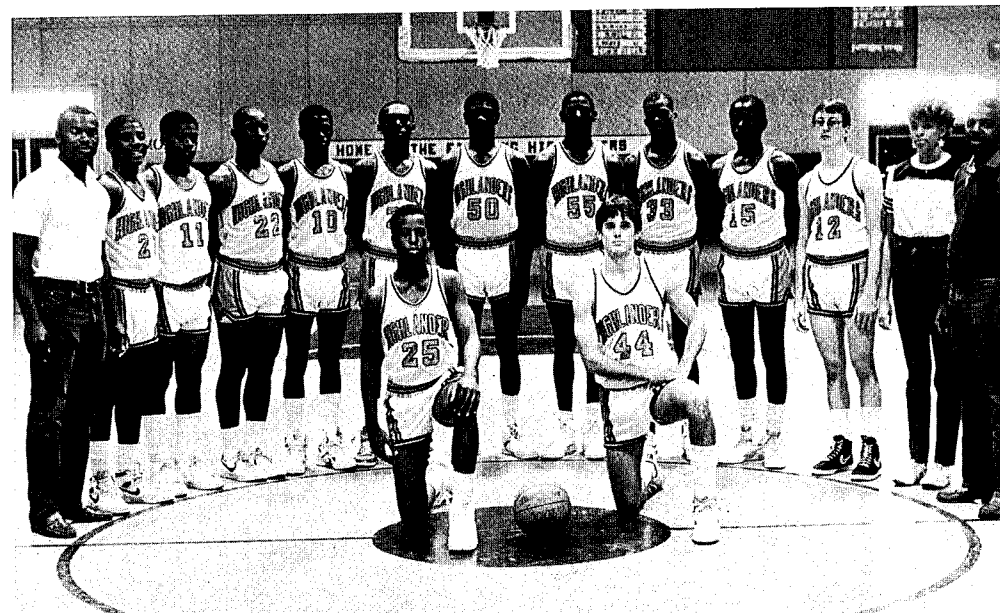
# Highlanders Dunk and Dribble Their Way to a Winning Season

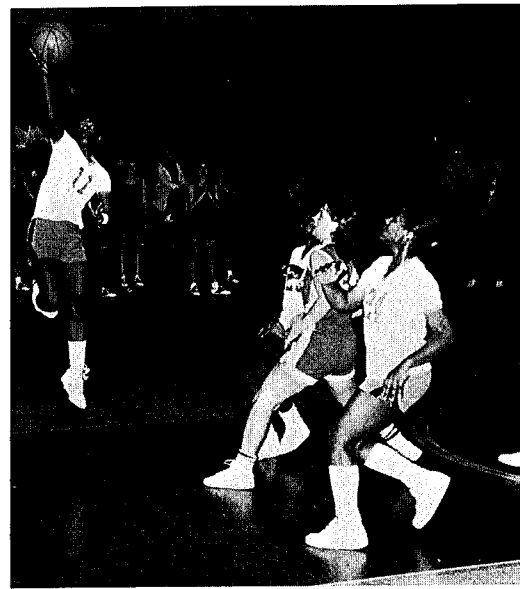
# Ladies Begin Rebuilding

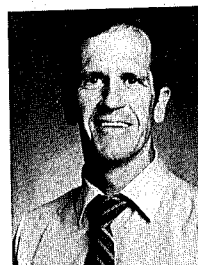


# Hooping Highlanders

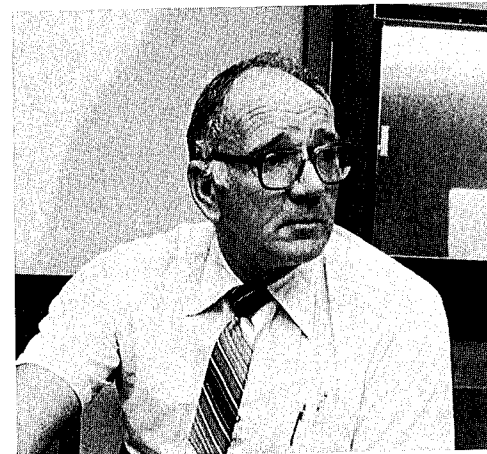

## Highlanders Reach District Simi-Finals

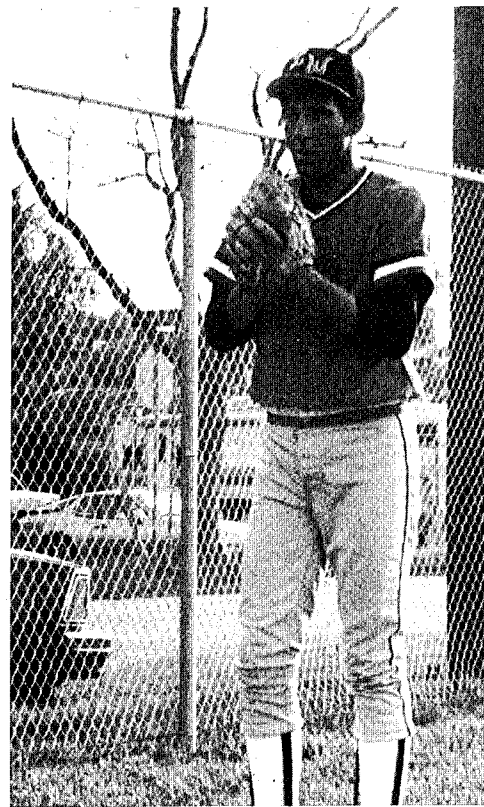

# THE +'s AND -'s of MATH

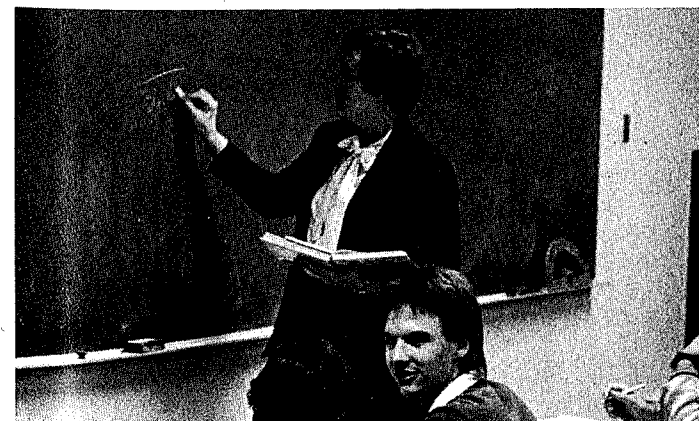

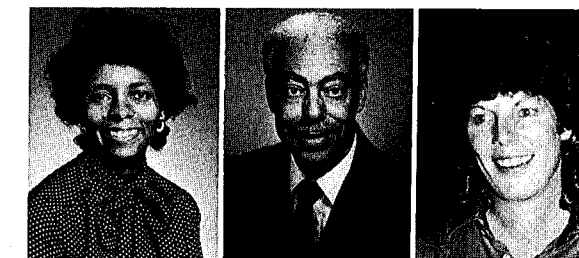
## Cultural Experiences

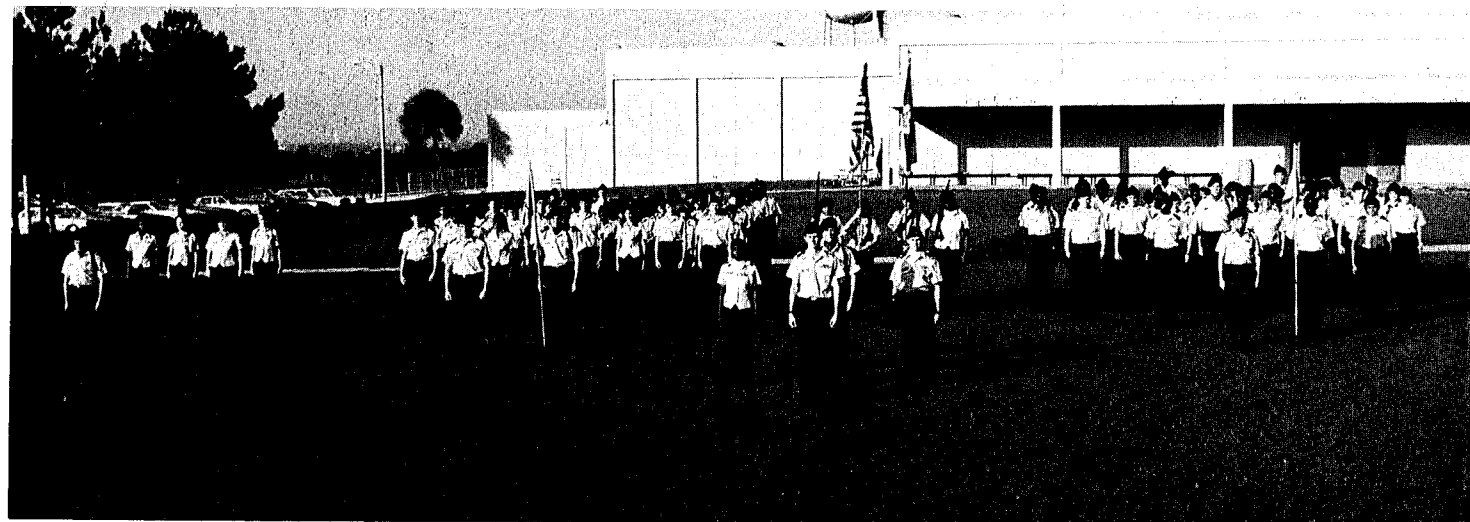
## Get In Step With J.R.O.T.C.

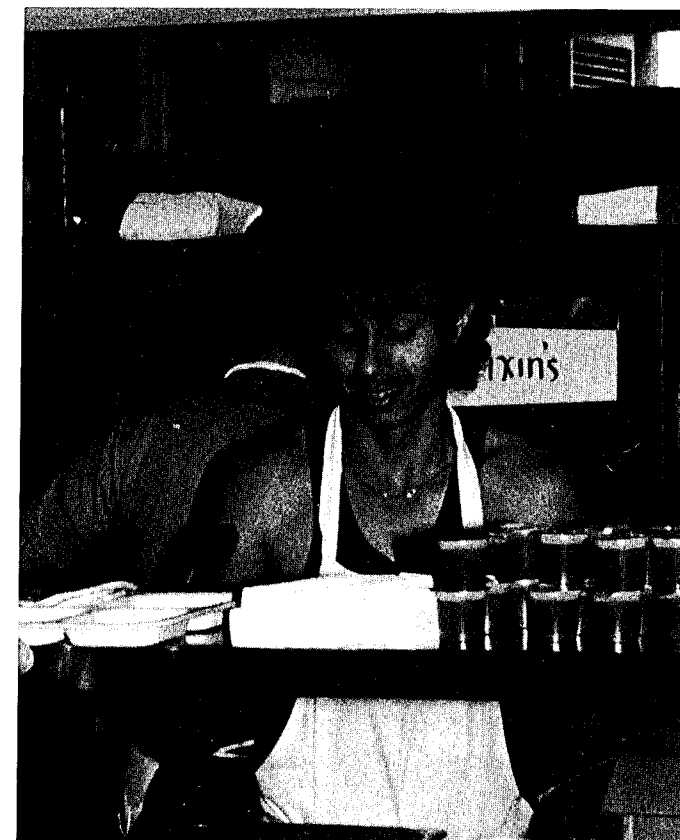

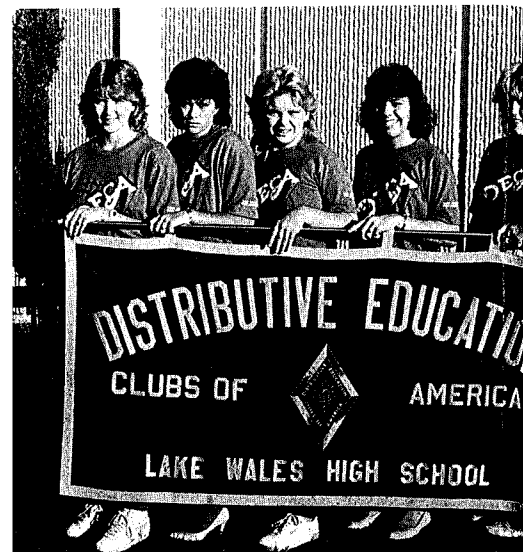


## DECA Flies to New Orleans

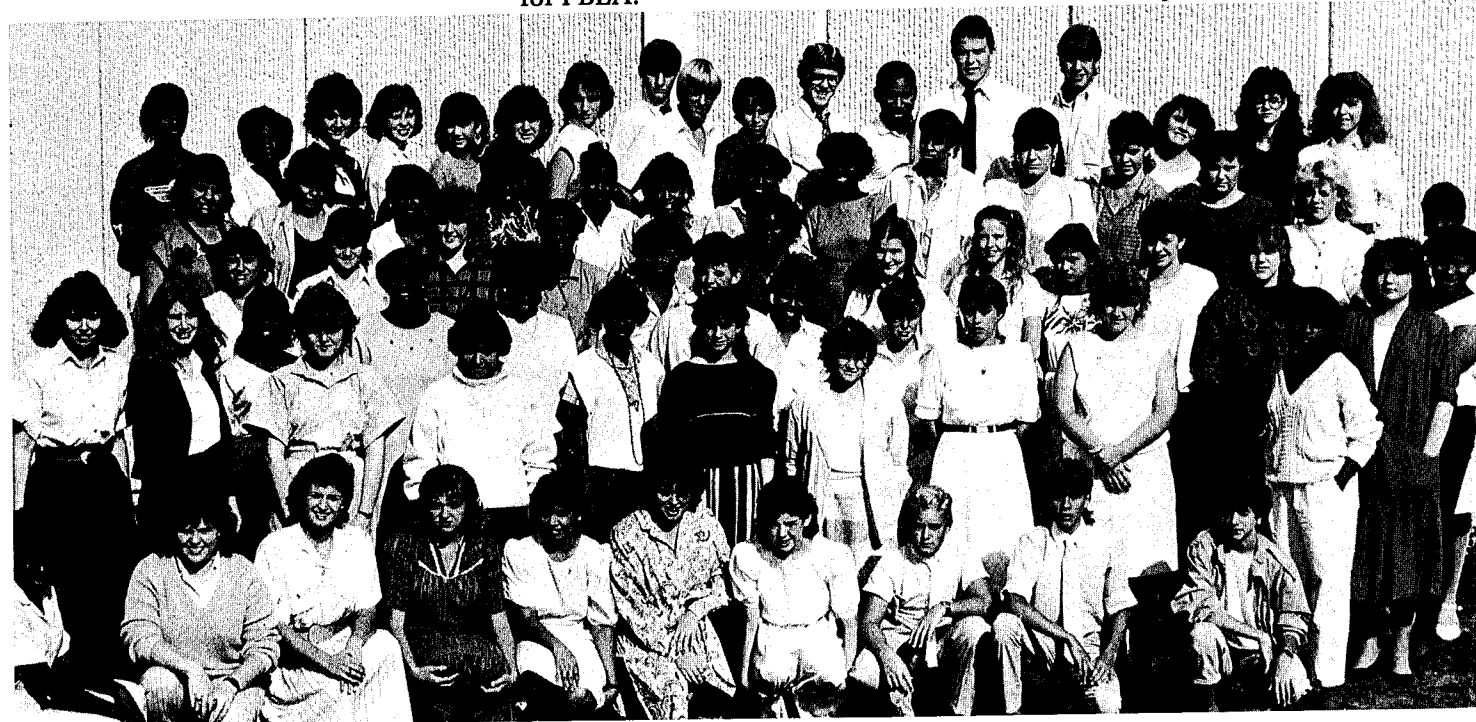

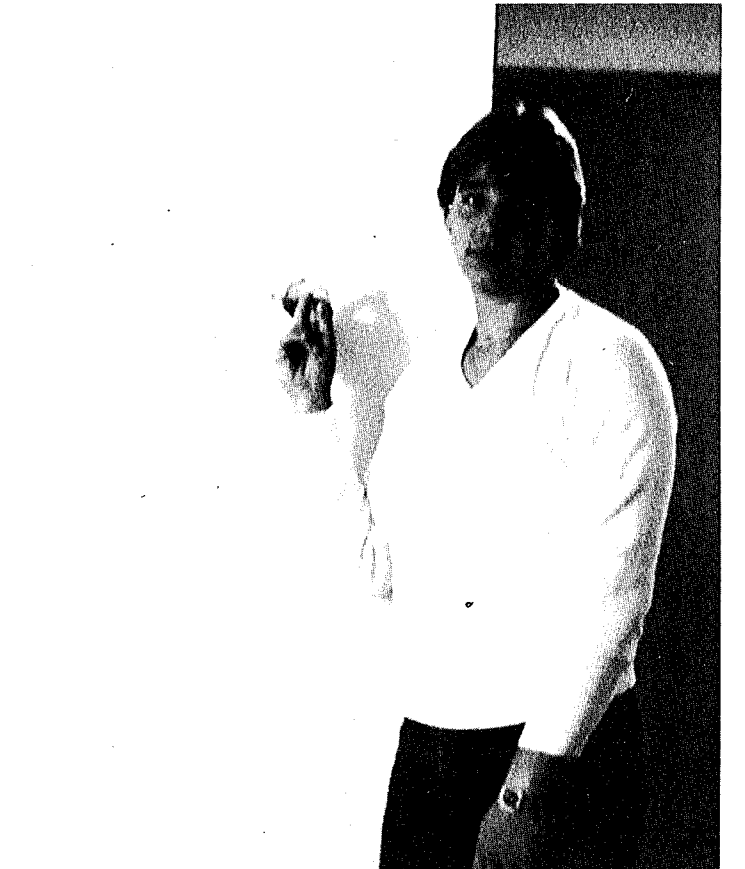
