Phonics

This week we will start Unit 1 of Fundations. Please refer to the Parent Letter to find skills that will be learned in class during this unit. This unit will cover closed syllables, digraphs, and blends.

Reading

This week in reading we will work on identifying how characters respond to certain events or challenges in a text. We will also work on asking and answering key details in a text. Students will learn how they can use illustrations to demonstrate understanding. We will look at nonficiton text and work on identifying a few text features that are used to help us comprehend. Identifying and using text features will be an ongoing skill this nine weeks.

English

Students will learn and work on identifying the difference between complete and incomplete sentecnces. We will also discuss the importance of using capitalization and punctuation when writing complete sentences. Students will learn the 4 types of sentences: telling, command, asking, and exclamatory.

Writing

Throughtout this nine weeks we will work on writing narratives with guidance from adults to edit and complete final pieces.
