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Chronically Absent

- Definition: A student is considered chronically absent when they miss a significant portion of the school year, regardless of whether the absences are excused or unexcused. Typically, this means missing 10% or more of the school year, which amounts to about 18 days in a 180-day school year.
- Reasons: Chronic absenteeism includes all absences—excused (due to illness, family emergencies, etc.) and unexcused (absences without a valid reason or notification to the school).
- Impact: Chronic absenteeism is often used as an indicator of potential academic
 risk, as frequent absences can hinder a student's ability to succeed in school and
 may point to broader issues such as health problems, family responsibilities, or
 disengagement.

Truant

- Definition: Truancy specifically refers to unexcused absences from school. A student is typically considered truant if they have a certain number of unexcused absences as defined by state or local laws.
- Reasons: Truancy often involves skipping school without parental knowledge or approval and is generally associated with intentional avoidance of school without a legitimate reason.
- Legal Implications: Truancy can lead to legal consequences for both students and parents. Policies are in place to address truancy, which may include interventions or referral to juvenile court systems.

Key Differences

- Focus: Chronic absenteeism focuses on the overall impact of absences on student learning, while truancy focuses on the issue of unexcused absences and the student's accountability.
- Measurement: Chronic absenteeism is measured by the percentage of total school days missed, while truancy is typically defined by a specific number of unexcused absences within a given time frame.
