during SY 2024-25 if Student A exhibits appropriate attendance, good behavior, and	
acceptable academic performance in the alternative program; and refrains from any	
dditional criminal conduct during the period of expulsion. It is further understood that if, upon return to Griswold Middle School, Student A violates any of the conditions outlined	
bove that the Superintendent will reimpose the expulsion for the remainder of the 180-	
period without having to reconvene a meeting of the Board of Education.
