The Amite County High School Boys Basketball team is the 2A District Champions.

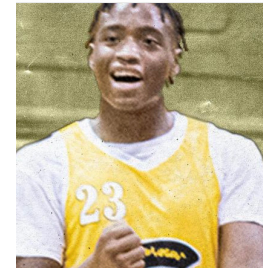

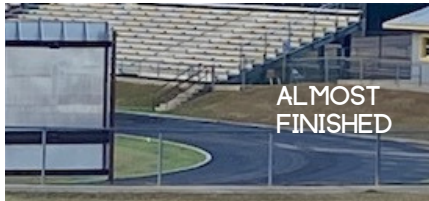
WE'RE GROWING...

Thank you, students, staff, faculty, community, and contractors for the school year thus far. We are well in 2022 with some great things happening on our Amite County campus.

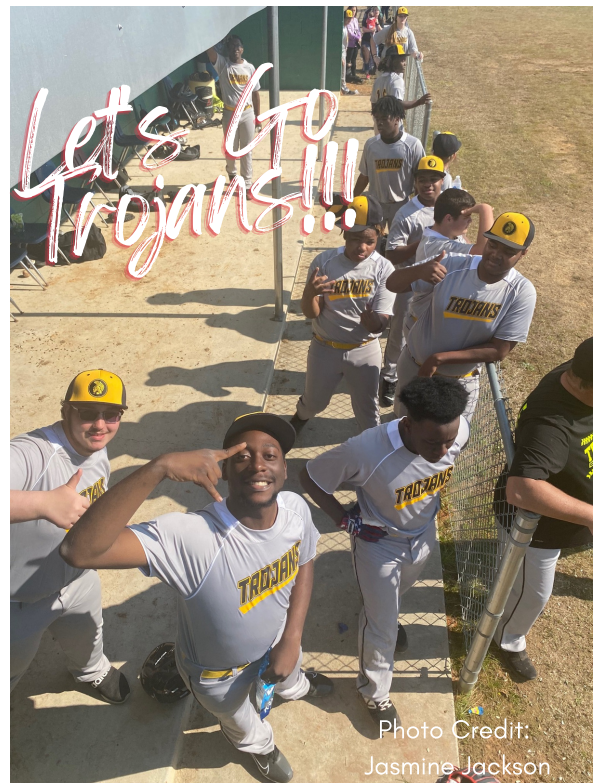
The elementary school's playground is in the groundbreaking process.
