Seniors of 1980, you are a proud class with many talents and ambitions. Your fellow classmates are proud to say we knew you and were a part of your special year to remember.



Nixon Resigns

The year, 1971, began with Richard Nixon clinging to the Presidency with the support of only 25 percent of his countrymen. From there, it was constant decline for him all the way. Nixon's role was uncovered during the year as the complex affair called Watergate yielded most of its secrets.

The affair originally took its name from the Watergate, an office complex in Washington, D.C. On June 17, 1972, five men were arrested trying to repair an illegal wire tap on a telephone in the offices of the Democratic National Committee. The men were hired by the Committee for the reelection of the President, known as CREEP. The "break-in" was temporarily dismissed as a "third-rate" burglary by a Presidential spokesman and White House involvement was denied.

Meanwhile, the phrase "Watergate Affair" had begun to stand for every facet of the illegal activities of the Nixon administration. Included were the contributions made by individuals and corporations to the President's 1972 reelection campaign, the dropping of an antitrust suit against the international Telephone and Telegraph Corporation, the raising of prices on dairy goods, the President's delinquent income taxes, the spending of public moneys on the President's private

homes in Florida and California, illegal electronic and other surveillance, interference with the trial of Daniel Ellsberg, Presidential impounding of funds appropriated by Congress, and even the secret pre-invasion bombing of Cambodia by U.S. planes.

The walls of justice were caving in on Nixon. Embattled and beseiged, Nixon fought for survival. When impeachment fever was generated in government, Richard Nixon became the first U.S. President ever to resign. On August 8, 1972, on a nationwide television and radio address, Nixon announced his resignation. The next day, Nixon and his family left the White House with a tearful departure and Vice-President Gerald Ford was sworn in as President.

Gas Prices Soar

Two years ago who would have believed that gas prices would ever reach 70¢ per gallon. Now, thanks to the O.P.E.C. nations, people are paying up to \$1.50 for gas that was only costing 40¢ in 1970. This sudden increase changed the lifestyle of the entire country overnight; big cars were out, economy cars were in. Everyone drove slower and walked or bicycled more. There was always the same question in everyone's minds; how high will the gas prices go? No one knows yet!

Hurricane David Hits Coast

The small hurricane that was born far out in the ocean was watched by the entire east coast of the United States for days. Hurricane David slowly headed towards Florida.

On Labor Day, 1979, Hurricane David became a reality as it struck Key West. David then proceeded up the coast of the United States tearing a path of destruction from the southern tip of Florida to Maryland. Then David calmed to a tropical storm, finally dying altogether and leaving behind a torn country with a nightmare that it would not soon forget.

Tragedy of Guyana

In November, 1978, the former British colony of Guyana was catapulted into the headlines. The eyes of the world were drawn deep into Guyana's tropical jungles to the commune of a religious cult led by Reverend Jim Jones.

In 1977 Jones, an Indiana-born Protestant minister, and members of his California-based People's Temple moved to Guyana to establish an agricultural-religious commune called Jonestown. In 1978, United States Representative Leo J. Ryan (D. California) went to Jonestown to investigate charges that Jones was depriving

his followers of their civil rights. As Ryan and his group were preparing to leave on November 18th, he and four other Americans were shot and killed, allegedly by followers of Jones.

By order of Jones, their leader, nine hundred eleven of the cultists, including two hundred sixty children, were killed or took their own lives by drinking a poisonous liquid. Amid criticism of the State Department for not having foreseen or prevented the tragedy, U.S. troops were sent to airlift hundreds of bodies to Dover Air Force Base in Delaware and help to identify them.

Jones, who emphasized interracial harmony and social justice to outsiders, had moved to California in 1965. He was a mayoral appointee in San Francisco before 1977, when complaints about the inside workings of his movement led him and many of his disciples to establish Jonestown. The Jonestown incident, called an "orgy of suicide-murder-infanticide that defied all attempts at rational analysis," provoked extensive examinations of cult behavior. It also led to a move in Congress to reexamine national policies in regard to religious tolerance.

Test Tube Baby

Medical science successfully

achieved new dimensions on July 25, 1978, in Oldham, England, with the birth of a normal, healthy, 5 lb. 12 oz. girl to Gilbert and Liesley Brown. The child, who was named Louise Joy Brown, was the first human to have been conceived outside of the mother's womb. Her birth marked the culmination of years of painstaking research by two British doctors gynecologist Patrick Steptoe and physiologist Robert Edwards. This well-known team had won praise a few years before for their success in manipulating human eggs before and after fertilization.

Since that first medical breakthrough, several other "test tube" babies have been conceived. This development has given new hope to women who want children but are physically unable.

Styles and Fads of the Decade

In the seventies, clothing and hairstyles became more wearable, more classic, and more versatile. Women began to buy and wear what they felt was right for them, and they disregarded guidelines set by fashion designers. The sportswear industry boomed as clothing and sporting accessories grew in demand.

The "natural look" was considered the best look. Make-up was toned down and limited to the

bare essentials. Hairstyles varied from the short straight Dorothy Hamil to the long, free Fawcett hairdo; even men got in on the "afro" look.

People also became more health conscious during the seventies. Lifestyles changed to favor the active and youthful. Styles of dress and undress called for a lean, physically fit appearance. Jogging, vegetarianism and salad bars swept the country as health food stores sprung up everywhere.

The popularity of jeans continued to increase as chic names such as Gloria Vanderbilt and Calvin Klein battled the old favorite, Levis. T-shirts with those popular movie titles, Star Wars, Jaws, and Rocky were worn by many people. Some people chose to wear clogs, mood rings and flip-flops. Songs, movies and books were written about such far-out fads as discoing, skateboarding and C.B.ing. Besides the wild and zany ideas worn and practiced in the seventies, the decade is remembered more seriously as the age of computer development, the march of ERA, the explosion of space technology and a time of mourning for the deaths of such celebrities as Bina Crosby, Elvis Presley and John Wayne.
