The Feast of the Epiphany

The Gospel of Matthew, the only one to mention the Magi, states that they came "from the East". The account doesn't tell how many they were, but the three gifts they brought led to the assumption that there were three. The Magi are described as "falling down," "kneeling," or "bowing" in the worship of Jesus. This gesture had an important effect on Christian religious practices, and was adopted by the early Church.

The three gifts had spiritual meanings as well: gold as a symbol of kingship; frankincense, of deity; and myrrh (an embalming oil), of His impending death.

FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY

January 6, 2013

Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you. —Isaiah 60:1

THE YEAR OF FAITH (October 11, 2012, to November 24, 2013) The

Catechism of the Church is both an “authentic fruit of Vatican Council II” and a tool for aiding in its reception. The Extraordinary Synod of Bishops of 1985 suggested the preparation of a Catechism in order to offer the People of God a compendium of all Catholic doctrine and a sure point of reference for local catechisms. Pope John Paul II accepted this proposal as a desire which “fully responds to a real need of the universal Church and of the particular Churches.” Compiled in collaboration with the entire Episcopate of the Catholic Church, this Catechism “truly expresses what could be called the symphony of the faith.”



The Catechism includes “the new and the old” (cfr. Mt 13:52), because the faith is always the same yet the source of ever new light. To respond to this twofold demand, the Catechism of the Church repeats the old, traditional order already followed by the Catechism of St. Pius V, arranging the material in four parts: the Creed, the Sacred Liturgy, with pride of place given to the sacraments, the Christian way of life, explained beginning with the Ten Commandments, and finally, Christian prayer. At the same time, however, the contents are often expressed in a new way in order to respond to the questions of our age. This Catechism is a valid and legitimate instrument for ecclesial communion and a sure norm for teaching the faith. The content of faith finds its systematic and organic synthesis in the Catechism of the Catholic Church. Here, in fact, we see the wealth of teaching that the Church has received, safeguarded and proposed in her two thousand years of history. From Sacred Scripture to the Fathers of the Church, from theological masters to the saints across the centuries, the Catechism provides a permanent record of the many ways in which the Church has meditated on the faith and made progress in doctrine so as to offer certitude to believers in their lives of faith.

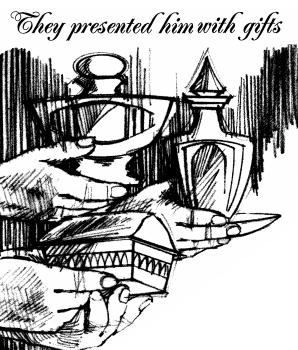
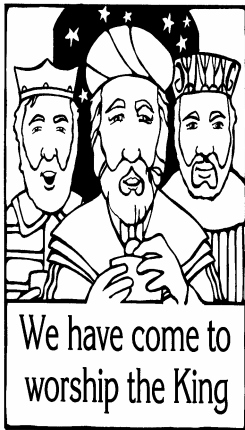


SCRIPTURE MEDITATION: FINDING GOD

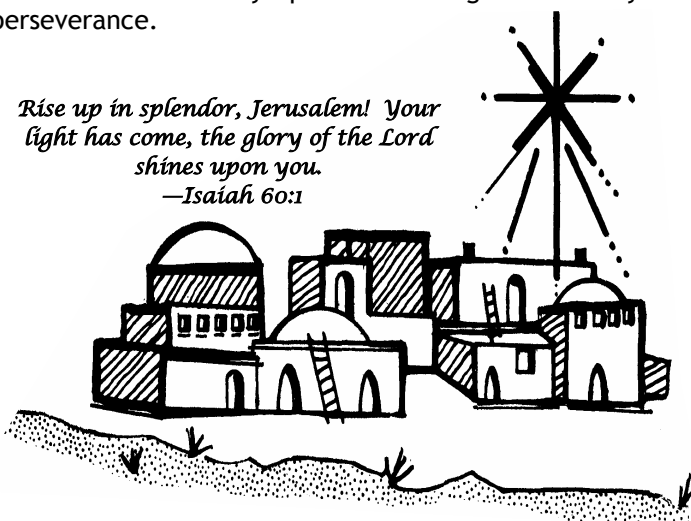

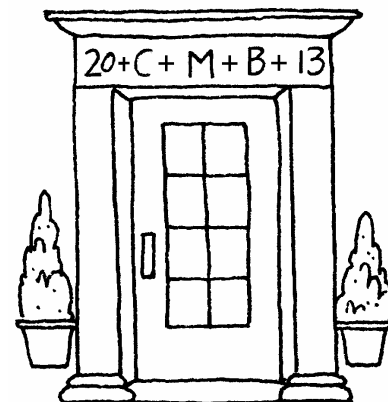
