Out of all the things parents can do, having high aspirations and expectations of your child has the biggest impact on their grades. Parental expectations include how important school is, their attitude towards teachers, and the value of education. This includes developing and maintaining communication with children about their school life. This helps parents nip any potential problems in the bud before they manifest into bigger issues. Strategies to help improve communication include being approachable, asking open ended questions and listening more than talking.

Parents are encouraged to read frequently and regularly with their child. Parents can help their child develop good reading habits by reading with them as part of a night-time routine, especially books that capture their attention and imagination. Have clear rules to deal with how they divide their homework and leisure time. Explaining why these rules are in place can help them eventually make better decisions later in life. Given that students often do their homework with their mobile phones in front of them, which can have a range of negative consequences having a clear structure and set of rules can help.

It's not easy being a parent. It's understandable that parents want the best for their child, but sometimes they don't know which strategies work best. What does seem clear is how having high aspirations, clear communication, good reading habits and clear homework rules can help students achieve success at school.

Hey Parents,

Have you ever heard of MTSS in schools? We want to make sure that you all know what it means and have some working knowledge in case it is brought up in any meetings that you attend!

A Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) integrates all students. It is a process that provides high-quality, research-based instruction targeted to learner needs. Needs are identified by monitoring students' progress. Adjustments to instruction and interventions are based on students' performance and rate of success. MTSS promotes a well integrated system, connecting general, gifted, and special education with intervention and enrichment services. MTSS provides high-quality, standards-based instruction and intervention that is matched to students' academic, social and behavioral needs. MTSS was previously referred to as Response to Intervention.

Key Principles of MTSS

- Early intervention
- •Multi-tiered model of service delivery that provides a continuum of support
- Instruction matched learners' needs
- •Progress monitoring data collected regularly to ensure effectiveness of instruction
- •Research-based interventions and instruction
- Interventions implemented consistently and correctly

What is the role of the parent/guardian in MTSS?

Parents play a critical role in supporting what their children are learning in school. Research has demonstrated that the more parents are involved in student learning, the higher the student achievement. Parents can be involved in the process by communicating any concerns to the child's teacher, providing insight into their child's learning and development, and assisting with identified interventions at home.
