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Goals and Objectives: This class will allow students to study and explore American literature from the Puritan era to modern literature. All genres covered in the main text will be addressed in class-- short stories, poetry, nonfiction, folklore, drama, and novels. The study and application of grammar, enriching vocabulary, research, and the writing process will be ongoing.

Expectations: You will be expected to be present, both physically and mentally, and take notes on the information being given. You will be expected to be prepared with all necessary materials and having done the homework for the day. Keep classwork, homework, notes and handouts organized in a binder or folder designated for only this class. Most homework for this class will be reading the material we will discuss the next day in class. Any classwork should be your number one priority during class and should be turned into the classwork box by the end of class. There will be group and team work in this class, and you will be expected to cooperate with others and share ideas in a kind and respectful manner. If you finish an assignment before the class is ready to move on, you should be reading silently (any book) or reviewing notes. I do not mind working on work for another class as long as you are caught up on work for my class and not being a distraction.

Materials:

- Binder or folder for homework, classwork, and handouts (please stay organized!)

Policies:

- Absences: If you are absent, you are responsible for picking up any missed handouts, returned work, and assignments from the designated station. Please check Google Classroom while you are out to see what we are doing. Classwork and homework from that day will be due the school day after you return. Please come to me if there are extenuating circumstances. If you will be gone for several days for a trip, please let me know 2-3 days beforehand.

- Late Work: If work is turned in late, it will take a 20% off penalty for each school day late. Late work will be accepted up to a week after it is due. Please come to me if there are extenuating circumstances.
